What happened in December and what is planned next?

During December, work continued on the new bridge with the installation of the canopy for the new station entrance in Marian Street, and on Marian and Little Eveleigh streets.

Throughout January, work will continue on the New Southern Concourse, new station entrances and shared zones in Little Eveleigh and Marian streets.

Our standard construction hours are 7am to 6pm Monday to Friday and 8am to 6pm Saturday.

Due to events such as weather, some work may run slightly past 6pm, however these activities are not expected to be noisy.

Activities planned outside standard construction hours?

Electrical work, delivery of plant and equipment, installation and pre-assembly of bridge components including steelwork, stairs, lifts, canopies, roof panels and screens will occur during the following times.

- **2am Saturday 21 to 2am Monday 23 January**

During this time, pedestrian access to Platform 10 will be closed and traffic control / detour signs will direct pedestrians via Gibbons Street.

Night work

Material and equipment removal, deliveries, concrete pouring, relocation of electrical components and testing may also occur up to three nights per week, however these activities are not expected to be noisy.

Night work is required to ensure the safety of workers, pedestrians and motorists, and to minimise impacts to traffic.

Sometimes out of hours work can be noisy. A noise assessment is undertaken prior to the work and information provided to impacted residents closer to the date.

Station area and platforms

During January, work will continue at and around the station area and on platforms. This includes:

- fit out of the lift shafts, stairs, and bridge
- electrical work, including service installation
- concreting
- installation of steel parts across the bridge and platforms
- roofing across the bridge and platform canopies.

Behind Platform 1 rock breaking, excavation, concreting, drilling, material removal, and the installation of canopy parts, stairs and a lift shaft will occur.

Little Eveleigh Street

Work will continue during standard construction hours in the stage two construction area outside of 125-127 Little Eveleigh Street. This work includes:

- underground services exploration
- relocation of existing services
- installation of underground conduits and communication pits
- roadway and footpath excavation including removal of existing asphalt, concrete and kerbs
- backfilling and concreting
- service and stormwater installation and relocation
- kerb, drain, bollard, pipe and pavement installation
- landscaping, including tree planting
- tree and tree root investigation
- tree and tree stump removal.

Work will also continue inside 125-127 Little Eveleigh Street including the removal of materials, installation of external scaffolding, concreting, service installation and testing, and the installation of steel beams and columns.

A crane will operate behind Platform 1 to remove and deliver material and equipment to the building.

We would like to thank the community for their continued patience and support as the new shared zone is constructed.

Ivy Street

From **Monday 9 January**, work to widen the footpath in Ivy Street will start. **The street will be temporarily closed to vehicles and parking will also be temporarily removed.**

The street will remain open to pedestrians and cyclists on the dedicated cycle path. Signage, barriers and traffic controllers will safely direct vehicles during construction.

Work on Ivy Street includes installing barriers and fencing for the exclusion zone, temporary removal of a garden bed, excavation work and exploration of underground services. We will contact directly impacted stakeholders about this work.

Marian Street

Work in the Marian Street compound includes the assembly of bridge components, excavation, paving, fit out, tiling, painting and cladding installation for the electrical building, and service connections.

The canopy for the new station entrance and associated steel parts will also be installed within the Marian Street compound area.

Cranes will operate within the compound to assist with this work.

Where will work take place?

Project and work areas include the rail corridor, the site compounds at North Eveleigh and on Little Eveleigh, Lawson, Wilson, and Marian streets.

The site access points are at Newtown, Macdonaldtown, Eveleigh, and Erskineville.

What you may notice

Equipment to be used during January includes:

- cranes
- elevated work platforms
- access equipment
- flatbed crane trucks
- excavators
- dump trucks and tipper trucks
- core hole drills
- compactors
- forklifts
- concrete trucks and concrete pumps
- watercarts
- chainsaws
- lighting towers
- generators
- tree stump grinders
- mulchers
- work vehicles
- handheld power tools.

At times, the use of loud equipment may be needed. These include:

- power saws
- grinders
- jackhammers
- rollers
- rattle guns
- vacuum trucks
- rock hammers or breakers
- piling rigs.

The use of this equipment can cause vibration and may be noticeable to nearby residents. We will minimise noise and vibration impacts by turning off equipment when not in use and where possible, use noise absorbing blankets.

A real-time environmental management system is in place to ensure noise, vibration and dust levels are within our project requirements.
