

Redfern Station Upgrade

New Southern Concourse

What happened in September and what is planned next?

During September, work continued on the new bridge with the installation of the canopy for the new station entrance in Marian Street, and on Marian and Little Eveleigh Streets.

Throughout October, work will continue on the New Southern Concourse, new station entrances and shared zones in Little Eveleigh and Marian streets.

Our standard construction hours are 7am to 6pm Monday to Friday and 8am to 6pm Saturday.

Due to unforeseen events such as weather, some work may run slightly past 6pm, however these activities are not expected to be noisy.

Are activities planned outside standard construction hours?

Electrical work, delivery of plant and equipment, installation and pre-assembly of bridge components including steelwork, stairs, lifts, canopies, roof panels and screens will occur during the following times.

- **2am Saturday 8 to 2am Monday 10 October**
- **2am Saturday 15 to 2am Monday 17 October**

Traffic control and detour signs will be in place to direct pedestrians via Gibbons Street.

Hydrostatic testing of the fire hydrant pipework in the bridge and the Marian Street compound is being conducted at night for safety reasons. We will get in touch with impacted stakeholders about this work.

Material and equipment removal, deliveries, concrete pouring, relocation of electrical components and testing may also occur up to three nights per week. These work activities are not expected to be noisy.

Why are activities planned outside standard construction hours?

Night work is required to be undertaken outside of standard construction hours to ensure the safety of workers, pedestrians and motorists, and to minimise impacts to traffic.

Sometimes out of hours work can be noisy. A noise assessment will be undertaken prior to the work and more information will be provided to impacted residents closer to the date.

Station area and platforms update

During October, work will continue at and around the station area and on platforms. This includes:

- fit out of the lift shafts, stairs, and bridge
- electrical work, including service installation
- concreting work
- installation of steel parts across the bridge and platforms
- roofing work across the bridge and platform canopies.

Work will also continue behind Platform 1 including rock breaking, excavation, concreting, drilling, material removal, and the installation of canopy parts, stairs and a lift shaft.

Little Eveleigh Street update

Work will continue on Little Eveleigh Street during standard construction hours in the stage two construction area. This work includes:

- underground services exploration
- relocation of existing services
- installation of underground conduits and communication pits
- roadway and footpath excavation including removal of existing asphalt, concrete and kerbs
- backfilling and concreting
- service and stormwater installation and relocation
- kerbing, drain, bollard, pipe, landscaping and pavement installation
- tree and tree roots investigation
- tree and tree stump removal.

We would like to thank the community for their continued patience and support as the new shared zone is constructed.

Work will continue at 125-127 Little Eveleigh Street including the removal of materials, installation of external scaffolding, concreting, hammering, service installation and testing, and the installation of steel beams and columns.

A crane will operate behind Platform 1 to remove and deliver material and equipment into the building.

Service investigation, excavation and stormwater installation will also take place within the Wilson Street reserve. The work will be completed in stages to ensure pedestrian and vehicle access is maintained throughout the work.

Marian Street update

Work in the Marian Street compound includes the assembly of bridge components, excavation, fit out, tiling, painting and cladding installation for the electrical building, and service connections.

The canopy for the new station entrance and associated steel parts will also be installed within the Marian Street compound area. Cranes will operate within the compound to assist with this work.

In October, final activities will continue in the work area on Marian Street during standard construction hours for the new shared zone.

This work includes service stormwater and drainage installation, pavement sealing and completion, and landscaping.

From Monday 17 to Friday 21 October a temporary road closure on Rosehill and Marian streets, and removal of five parking spaces on Cornwallis Street will be in place. This is to allow the shared zone paving to be sealed.

As this work is weather dependent, we will keep the community updated should the dates change.

Where will work take place?

Project and work areas include the rail corridor, at our site compounds at North Eveleigh and on Little Eveleigh, Lawson, Wilson, and Marian streets. The site access points are at Newtown, Macdonaldtown, Eveleigh, and Erskineville.

Upcoming changes to parking

Parking will be temporarily removed on surrounding streets for service searching and the delivery of plant and equipment to our site compounds.

- **Rosehill Street:** Up to five parking spaces will be temporarily unavailable **from Saturday 1 to Monday 31 October**.

- **Cornwallis Street:** Up to five parking spaces will be temporarily unavailable **from Monday 17 to Friday 21 October.**

What you may notice

Equipment to be used during the work activities in this notification may include:

- cranes
- elevated work platforms
- access equipment
- flatbed crane trucks
- excavators
- dump trucks and tipper trucks
- core hole drills
- compactors
- forklifts
- concrete trucks and concrete pumps
- watercarts
- chainsaws
- lighting towers
- generators
- tree stump grinders
- mulchers
- work vehicles
- handheld power tools.

At times, the use of equipment that operate at a higher sound level than standard equipment may be needed. These include:

- power saws
- grinders
- jackhammers
- rollers
- rattle guns
- vacuum trucks
- rock hammers or breakers
- piling rigs.

The use of this equipment can cause vibration and may be noticeable to nearby residents. We will minimise noise and vibration impacts by turning off equipment when not in use and where possible, use noise absorbing blankets.

A real-time environmental management system is in place to ensure noise, vibration and dust levels are within our project requirements.
