What happened in August and what is planned next?

During August, work continued on the bridge with the installation of the canopy for the new station entrance in Marian Street, and on Marian and Little Eveleigh Streets.

Throughout September, work activities will continue on the New Southern Concourse, and new station entrances and shared zones in Little Eveleigh and Marian Streets.

Our standard construction hours are 7am to 6pm Monday to Friday and 8am to 6pm Saturday. Due to unforeseen events such as weather, some construction activities may run slightly past 6pm, however these activities are not expected to be noisy.

Are there activities planned outside of standard construction hours?

Electrical work, delivery of plant and equipment, installation and pre-assembly of bridge components including steelwork, stairs, lifts, canopies, roof panels and screens will occur during the following times.

- **2am Saturday 17 September to 2am Monday 19 September**
- **2am Saturday 24 September to 2am Monday 26 September**

During these times, pedestrian access to Platform 10 will be closed and a detour will be in place.

Service investigation, excavation and stormwater installation will also occur intermittently at the corner of Little Eveleigh Street and Lawson Street on the following dates.

- **8am Saturday 17 September to 6am Monday 19 September**
- **8am Saturday 24 September to 6am Monday 26 September**

A single lane closure on Lawson Street will be in place during these times. Traffic control, a detour and information on signage will be in place to safely direct and assist motorists, cyclists, and pedestrians.

Minor traffic delays may be experienced during the stop and slow traffic arrangement. Please refer to the map on the last page for more information.

If there are weather impacts, the work activities will occur during another weekend, however, we will keep the community updated.

Traffic control and detour signs will be in place to direct pedestrians via Gibbons Street.

Material and equipment removal, deliveries, concrete pouring, relocation of electrical components and testing may also occur up to three nights per week. These work activities are not expected to be noisy.

Why are there activities planned outside of standard construction hours?

Night work is required to be undertaken outside of standard construction hours to ensure the safety of workers, pedestrians and motorists, and to minimise impacts to traffic.

Sometimes out of hours work can be noisy. A noise assessment will be undertaken prior to the work and more information will be provided to impacted residents closer to the date.

Station area and platforms update

During September, work will continue at and around the station area and on platforms. This includes:

- fit out of the lift shafts, stairs, and bridge
- electrical work, including service installation
- concreting work
- installation of steel parts across the bridge and platforms
- roofing work across the bridge and platform canopies.

Work will also continue behind Platform 1 including rock breaking, excavation, concreting, drilling, material removal, and the installation of canopy parts, stairs and a lift shaft.

Little Eveleigh Street update

Stage one construction is complete and open to pedestrians and resident vehicles. Work activities will continue on Little Eveleigh Street during standard construction hours in the stage two construction area. This work includes:

- underground services exploration
- relocation of existing services
- installation of underground conduits and communication pits
- roadway and footpath excavation including removal of existing asphalt, concrete and kerbs
- backfilling and concreting
- service and stormwater installation and relocation
- kerbing, drain, bollard, pipe, landscaping and pavement installation
- tree and tree roots investigation
- tree and tree stump removal.

We would like to thank the community for their continued patience and support during construction of the new shared zone.

Work activities will continue at 125-127 Little Eveleigh Street including the removal of materials, installation of

external scaffolding, concreting, hammering, service installation and the installation of steel beams. A crane will operate behind Platform 1 to remove and deliver material and equipment into the building.

Service investigation, excavation and stormwater installation will also take place within the Wilson Street reserve. The work will be completed in stages to ensure pedestrian and vehicle access is maintained throughout the work activities.

Ivy Street Update

From **Monday 19 September**, work on the widening of the footpath in Ivy Street will commence. **The street will be temporarily closed to vehicles and parking will be temporarily removed.** The street will remain open for pedestrians and cyclists on the dedicated cycle path. Signage, barriers and traffic controllers will be in place to safely direct vehicles during construction.

Work activities include installing barriers and fencing for the exclusion zone, temporary removal of a garden bed, excavation work and exploration of underground services. We will get in touch with directly impacted stakeholders about this work.

Marian Street update

Work in the Marian Street compound includes the assembly of bridge components, excavation, fit out, tiling, painting and cladding installation for the electrical building, and service connections.

The canopy for the new station entrance and associated steel parts will also be installed within the Marian Street compound area. Cranes will operate within the compound to assist with these work activities.

In September, final work activities will continue in the work area on Marian Street during standard construction hours for the new shared zone.

This work includes service stormwater and drainage installation, pavement sealing and completion, and landscaping.

During September, a **temporary road closure on Rosehill and Marian Streets, and removal of 5 parking spaces on Cornwallis Street** will be in place for a period of five days, **from Monday 19 September to Friday 23 September**. This is to allow the paving for the shared zone to be sealed.

As this work is weather dependent, we will keep the community updated should these dates change.

Work will also be undertaken to modify a water connection on Marian Street. This work will be undertaken with Sydney Water and may require a temporary loss of water to some properties. Sydney Water will directly notify any impacted properties closer to the date.

Where will work take place?

Project and work areas include inside the rail corridor, at our site compounds at North Eveleigh and Marian Street, and on Little Eveleigh, Lawson, Wilson, and Marian Streets. The site access points are at Newtown, Macdonaldtown, Eveleigh, and Erskineville.

Upcoming changes to parking

Parking will be temporarily removed on surrounding streets for service searching and the delivery of plant and equipment to our site compounds.

- **Rosehill Street:** Up to five parking spaces will be temporarily unavailable **from Thursday 1 September to Friday 30 September**.
- **Cornwallis Street:** Up to five parking spaces will be temporarily unavailable **from Monday 19 September to Friday 23 September**.
- **Wilson Street:** Up to six parking spaces will be temporarily unavailable **from Wednesday 14 September to Wednesday 21 September**.

What you may notice

Equipment used during all of the activities outlined in this notification may include cranes, elevated work platforms, access equipment, flatbed crane trucks, excavators, dump trucks, tipper trucks, core hole drills, compactors, forklifts, concrete trucks and concrete pumps, watercarts, chainsaws, lighting towers, generators, tree stump grinders, mulchers, work vehicles and handheld power tools.

At times, our activities require the use of equipment that operates at a higher sound level than standard equipment.

These include power saws, grinders, jackhammers, rollers, rattle guns, vacuum trucks, rock hammers or breakers, and piling rigs. The use of this equipment can cause vibration and may be noticeable to nearby residents. We will minimise noise and vibration impacts by turning off equipment when not in use and where possible, use noise absorbing blankets.

A real time environmental management system is in place to ensure noise, vibration and dust levels are operating within our project requirements.
