Construction of the new shared zone

In January 2022, we will be starting construction on the new shared zone on Little Eveleigh Street. This shared zone will improve pedestrian connections and flow in and around the station area.

We would like to thank the community for their feedback during the community sessions held in July 2021. The new shared zone will provide streetscape opportunities such as improved lighting, drainage, and landscaping.

What is happening on Little Eveleigh Street?

Construction will mainly be in two stages:

- **Stage one:** between Lawson Street and 125-127 Little Eveleigh Street. Please refer to the map below.
- **Stage two:** between 125-127 Little Eveleigh Street and Ivy Lane.

Once these stages are complete, finishing work will occur to complete the shared zone, including work at the new station entrance and street area outside of 125-127 Little Eveleigh Street.

From **Monday 17 January 2022**, we will start construction on the new Little Eveleigh Street shared zone. See page 4 for more information about work in January on the shared zone.

What does this mean for me?

During construction, Little Eveleigh Street will be temporarily closed to vehicles and cyclists to enable safe construction of the shared zone. Access for pedestrians and to buildings will be maintained.

The existing car share space, shuttle bus stop, bike racks and all street parking will also be relocated, with the bike racks to be reinstated once construction is finished.

How will we manage impacts?

The project team understands construction activities may cause disruption for the community and we will seek to minimise impacts as much as possible. Work will mainly be undertaken during standard construction hours and in line with the project's Construction Noise and Vibration Management Plan and Out of Hours Protocol.

Traffic control will be in place. Please refer to the map above for details.

There may be minor disruptions to property access of up to a few hours to complete work directly in front of a property. However, we will work with residents to try and schedule this work for a time that is most suitable.

Introducing the Construction Concierge

We have created an exclusive Construction Concierge service dedicated to Little Eveleigh Street residents and businesses. This service will be in place during construction of the new shared zone to help minimise impacts and provide more assistance during this time.

The concierge service can help assist residents with both long-term and day to day requirements such as:

- taxi pick up and ride share such as Uber
- deliveries and removalists
- property access

It is recommended that residents catch ride share services and taxis from Ivy Street or Lawson Street (refer to the map for more details). If you or your visitors have accessibility needs, the Construction Concierge can organise a suitable location for pick-up or drop-off.

Parking and garage access

An interim car park has been built to offset the existing parking in Little Eveleigh Street. The car park will be available exclusively to residents and businesses of Little Eveleigh Street including dedicated spaces for residents whose garages are not accessible during construction. Parking permits for the car park will be allocated to Little Eveleigh Street residents who currently hold a City of Sydney parking permit.

Both permits must be always on display to ensure only permit holders are parking in the car park.

Traffic control or a security guard will be present to ensure only permit holders are accessing and using the car park. An access code will be provided closer to date to open the boom gate to the car park.

To apply for a parking permit scan the QR code or visit the webpage. Please be aware, a valid permit does not guarantee a spot in the car park.



Weekly rubbish collection and utilities

There will be no changes to rubbish collection services. During this time, please continue to make your bins available at the front of your property or business on collection day, and the project team will coordinate their pick-up and return.

Please refer to the map for where the bins will be placed for collection, after which, they will be returned to your property. Your property number will be placed on the bins to clearly identify which bins belong to which properties.

While we don't anticipate any impact to services or utilities during this time, we will work closely with service providers, such as Ausgrid, and will keep you informed should a service be impacted at your property.

Emergency services

Emergency access will be maintained during construction. We will continue to work with NSW Police, Fire and Rescue NSW, and NSW Ambulance to ensure their needs are addressed and incorporated into the construction plan.

What work will be happening in January?

From **Monday 17 January to Monday 31 January**, work will occur during standard construction hours, **7am to 6pm Monday to Friday and 8am to 6pm Saturday**.

The work planned for January includes:

- installation of barriers and fencing for the exclusion zone and temporary road closure
- exploration of underground services

- removal of existing pavement and potholing work
- tree removal.

Traffic control will be in place to assist with these changes. All activities being undertaken adhere to COVID safe practices and will continue to be in line with current NSW Health COVID-19 Public Health Orders and restrictions.

Building a safe shared zone

To enable safe construction and operation of the new shared zone, some trees will need to be removed. An assessment was completed by an independent arborist which identified four trees on Little Eveleigh Street need to be removed.

During stage one of the shared zone construction, one of these trees will be removed, please refer to the map overleaf to view the location of the tree.

We will prioritise retaining as many trees as possible and work with an independent arborist during construction to assess if further trees need to be removed.

As part of our continued commitment to sustainability, we will offset 100 percent of any vegetation cleared, both native and otherwise. This means that for any vegetation unable to be retained, we will balance by planting new vegetation in line with the project's tree offset strategy and in consultation with the City of Sydney.

We will keep the community updated as the project progresses and provide more information on stage two closer to the date.

What's next?

We will be contacting residents to get their feedback on planting in front of their property as part of the detailed design. This will be an opportunity for residents to contribute to the overall look and feel of the street.

We will also provide construction updates in our monthly notifications and get in contact if there are any changes in impact or additional information.
