

# Two new levels are now open at St Marys Multi-Storey Commuter Car Park for transport customers

Transport for NSW is delivering improvements across the state to create vibrant, productive, liveable and sustainable places that support community health, safety and wellbeing.

To promote future employment growth, support the local population now and into the future, and to improve connections across Greater Western Sydney, St Marys Station and precinct is being renewed. As part of this precinct renewal, the existing multi-storey commuter car park has been extended with two new levels providing over 250 parking spaces. These new spaces will help manage local parking changes ahead of the construction of the Sydney Metro-Western Sydney Airport project and Transport Park&Ride infrastructure, meaning there will be an overall increase of around 100 commuter parking spaces in the area.

The project has been jointly funded by the NSW and Australian Governments, supporting the new metro station and interchange at St Marys. The new metro line would connect St Marys to the new Nancy-Bird Walton Western Sydney International Airport and Aerotropolis and provide an easy, efficient and accessible interchange to the existing T1 Western Line.

## New features of the commuter car park

The upgraded multi-storey commuter car park features two new levels providing over 250 parking spaces. A new lift, an extension of the existing lift and stairs, wayfinding signage, CCTV and LED lighting with motion detection and daylight sensors to increase accessibility, safety and security at the facility. Seven new accessible parking spaces have been added to the existing car park. The multi-storey commuter car park will also be fitted with Transport Park&Ride Infrastructure.

## Sky Over Wianamattagal Country

Dharug man, Shane Smithers has created an original artwork that forms part of an Acknowledgement of Country sign for the newly extended car park. The Aboriginal word 'Wianamattagal' is the contraction of three words; Wiana, meaning mother, Matta, meaning a place of water and Gal meaning people.

The name Wianamatta or the place of Mother's water credits the earth for the creek ever-flowing with 'Mother's water'. Even when the land is drought ravaged, when the grass has turned to straw, ground water keeps the creek flowing. Wianamattagal country was and is a place of abundance even in hard times.

Transport for NSW and the artist acknowledge the Wianamattagal clan of the Dhurag people as the traditional owners and custodians of this land and pays respect to Elders past and present. We welcome all who visit this place.

# Built with the environment in mind

The upgraded multi-storey commuter car park is designed and built to reduce embodied carbon emissions and adapt to climate change. The features include:

- provision for electric vehicle charging stations to be added in the future
- installation of smart lighting controls and solar powered security lighting to reduce operational energy consumption
- building the car park using low carbon concrete mixes with an average of 40% recycled material content, and procuring steel locally.

## Finishing work

In the coming months, you may notice some finishing work occurring around the commuter car park. This will include installation of Transport Park&Ride boom gates.
