# Upcoming construction work

## St Marys Commuter Car Park extension

We will be undertaking the following construction activities in April 2022:

- Continuing work on the external façade
- · Continuing work on a new, second lift
- Continuing work for future Transport Park&Ride boom gates
- Removal of scaffolding
- Landscaping around the multi-storey commuter car park

Level 3 of the multi-storey commuter car park is now open. Lift access is now available between the ground floor and level 3.

# St Marys - Sydney Metro - Western Sydney Airport Enabling Work

Transport for NSW is continuing enabling work at St Marys Station to prepare the site for construction of Sydney Metro – Western Sydney Airport. A portion of this work involves the relocation of the existing lift and stairs at the southern entrance to the station.

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Access to St Marys Station will be maintained at all times during this work which is due for completion in the last quarter of 2022.

Our work in April includes:

- Ongoing site establishment activities south of the station, including installation of hoarding and temporary removal of some existing street furniture and bike racks from within the site boundary
- Service protection work involving non-destructive digging and concrete activities
- Foundation work for the new stairs
- Temporary traffic impacts on Queen Street and Station Street adjacent to our work area, as required. Traffic control will be in place to facilitate the movement and mobilisation of plant, and to minimise the impact for buses and taxis
- Vegetation removal and tree trimming.

Signage, fencing, temporary pedestrian detours and traffic control will be in place as required to assist pedestrians, motorists, and cyclists around our work areas.

### **Construction hours**

Day work will be ongoing within our construction sites and in local streets during standard construction hours:

- · 7am to 6pm Monday to Friday; and
- 8am to 1pm on Saturdays.

Some work will be required to be undertaken outside of standard construction hours to minimise or avoid disruption to commuter services and/or road traffic. We will notify you in advance of any additional day or night work that may impact you.

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### Minimising community impacts

We understand construction activities may cause disruption to our closest neighbours, and every effort will be made to minimise the impacts where possible, including:

- Scheduling work during the day instead of at night where practicable
- Turning off equipment when not in use and using non-tonal reversing alarms to reduce potential noise impacts to the surrounding community
- Installing noise barriers to shield residents from high impact noise activities
- Engaging with communities affected by our projects through the distribution of monthly notifications, including information regarding the noise impacts of our projects, mitigation measures and the provision of contact details to facilitate two-way communication
- Conducting on-site monitoring to ensure compliance with strict environmental conditions relating to noise, vibration and dust management.

Work considered to be non-intrusive can be completed outside standard construction hours without notification. This work may include site walks, oversized deliveries, investigation work, and other lower impact activities.

### **Equipment**

Equipment used for our work includes but is not limited to excavators, piling rig, rock hammers, vacuum trucks, hand tools, concrete pumps and trucks, light vehicles, and generators.
