Thornleigh Station Upgrade

Transport for NSW | December 2022 and January 2023

The Thornleigh Station Upgrade is part of the Transport Access Program, a NSW Government initiative to provide a station that is accessible to people with a disability, limited mobility, parents and carers with prams, and customers with luggage.

What's next at Thornleigh?

Our work will include:

- new lift fit outs
- upgrading Railway Parade
- landscaping work on The Esplanade
- installing a new bus shelter on The Esplanade
- installing structural steel screens and awnings for the new lifts.

We will be working to resurface some of the areas of the Commuter Car Park on The Esplanade from **5am Saturday 26 until 10pm Sunday 27 November**.

During this time, there will be limited spaces available and traffic entering and exiting the car park will be assisted by traffic controllers. Please allow extra time in your commute and refer to the signs for further information.

Work schedule

Our day work hours remain as **Monday to Friday from 7am to 6pm**, and **Saturdays from 8am to 1pm**.

Work schedules are subject to change due to permits, weather and site conditions. Further notification will be provided should there be significant changes to our construction schedule.

Holiday closedown period

The site will be closed over the holiday period from Thursday 22 December 2022 until Monday 9 January 2023.

During this time, security will be monitoring the work site and our 1800 number will be operational for urgent calls.

Parking and traffic impacts

From early January, around <u>five car parking spaces</u> will remain temporarily unavailable on Railway Parade between Station Street and Bellevue Street.

How this work may affect you

Our work throughout December will involve the use of a range of equipment including excavators, vacuum trucks, road saws, trucks, tilt trays, concrete trucks and pumps, dump trucks, jackhammers, compactors, grinders, and various hand and power tools.

Our work will be noisy at times. Wherever possible, measures will be put in place to reduce noise including turning off equipment when not in use, placing equipment as far away as possible from properties and using nontonal reversing beepers.
