Thornleigh Station Upgrade

Transport for NSW | September 2022

The Thornleigh Station Upgrade is part of the Transport Access Program, a NSW Government initiative to provide a station that is accessible to people with a disability, limited mobility, parents / carers with prams, and customers with luggage.

What's next at Thornleigh?

Throughout September, work will include:

- fit-out of new lifts
- ongoing construction of the new stairs and ramp within Benowie Walkway
- upgrading the new family accessible toilet and the unisex ambulant toilet
- vegetation clearing and tree removal on Railway Parade
- landscaping and pavement work on The Esplanade, including upgrading the existing bus shelter
- commencing site investigations, including survey work on Railway Parade.
- one accessible car space will be temporarily unavailable until October to allow for a temporary ramp and footpath to be in place
- approximately four parking spaces on the station side of The Esplanade between Wells and Eddy streets will be temporarily unavailable from early September for around four weeks.
- the existing bus stop on The Esplanade (**Stop ID 212052**), will be relocated 30 metres south from mid-September for around 4 weeks. This relocation is required to allow for the demolition of the existing bus shelter and landscaping and pavement work.

Upcoming work in September

Work will continue Monday to Friday from 7am until 6pm, and from 8am until 1pm on Saturdays.

We have scheduled weekend work from **6am Saturday 24 September to 10pm Sunday 25 September**, weather and site conditions permitting. We will be installing new security screens on Benowie Walkway.

Parking and traffic impacts

While we complete the landscaping and pavement work on The Esplanade, the following parking and traffic changes will be in place.

Temporary closure of toilets

We expect that the new family accessible and unisex ambulant toilets will be open by the end of September.

Railway Parade

Following consultation with Hornsby Shire Council, Railway Parade will be upgraded to improve station accessibility for all customers.

We will be carrying out site investigations, vegetation and weed clearing. Temporary parking removal will be required to facilitate this work.



How this work may affect you

Our work throughout September will use a range of equipment including excavators, vacuum trucks, road saws, tipper trucks, flatbed trucks, tilt trays, concrete trucks and pumps, elevated working platforms, lighting towers, dump trucks, jackhammers, work vehicles, augers, grinders, chain saws, chippers, cranes, and various hand and power tools.

Our work will be noisy at times. Where possible, measures will be implemented to reduce noise and dust associated with these works, including adding shade cloth mesh to fencing, turning off equipment when not in use, placing equipment as far away as possible from properties and using non-tonal reversing beepers.

Changes to scheduled work

Work schedules are subject to change due to permits, weather, and site conditions. Further notification will be provided should there be significant changes to the construction program.
