

## Update on Derwent Road night works

In a recent Transport for NSW community notification about road works at the northern end of Derwent Road including 40 Derwent Road, Bringelly, we informed you about upcoming work scheduled outside of standard construction hours.

Scheduling this work at night will help residents immediately surrounding the construction zone carry out their operations and activities during the day, and it will support the construction team to safely carry out essential activities to enable the future construction of the Sydney Metro – Western Sydney Airport.

The new Sydney Metro rail will become the transport spine for Greater Western Sydney, connecting communities and travellers with the new Western Sydney International (Nancy-Bird Walton) Airport and the growing region. The city-shaping project, from St Marys through to the new airport and the Western Sydney Aerotropolis, will provide a major economic stimulus for western Sydney, supporting more than 14,000 jobs during construction for the NSW and national economies. The 23-kilometre new railway will link residential areas with job hubs including the new Aerotropolis and connect travellers from the new airport to the rest of Sydney's public transport system.

Abergeldie Contractors Pty Ltd will be undertaking **night works** on behalf of Transport for NSW at the northern end of Derwent Road, including 40 Derwent Road, for up to **5 nights**. These works are planned to take place between **Monday 7 February 2022** and **Friday 11 February 2022**. To minimise noise impacts, we will finish high noise works by midnight whenever possible, use alternative low noise equipment, stagger the use of noisy equipment and switch off equipment when not in use.

When work is required outside standard construction hours, a noise assessment is prepared in accordance with the project's planning approval along with the Sydney Metro Construction Noise and Vibration Strategy and Out of Hours Work Protocol.

A noise assessment has been completed for the upcoming work, which indicates noise levels at your property are anticipated to be 'quiet'. More information is available in the Managing Construction Noise fact sheet (attached) and recent community notifications for Bringelly are available here:
