

# Narooma Wharf replacement

The NSW Government is delivering major improvements to maritime infrastructure and facilities across the state to help the boating and wider community safely access, use and navigate our rivers and coastal waters.

## Introduction

Transport for NSW (TfNSW) is planning to demolish and rebuild Narooma Wharf due to its age and deteriorated condition. TfNSW is also taking this opportunity to improve the safety for users of the facility by including floating components and a lower level landing in the new design. This will provide safer access for users boarding boats during high and low tides, which is currently challenging due to the fixed level of the existing wharf.

The objectives of the project are to:

- improve the safety and structural integrity of the wharf
- upgrade access and operational safety for vessels
- make the wharf more accessible to everyone, including those with mobility impairments and parents/carers with prams
- provide on-shore services for commercial vessels to improve environmental and business outcomes.


# Narooma Wharf replacement

## The proposal

This proposal includes the removal of the existing wharf at Narooma and the reconstruction of a new wharf in the same location.

Key features of the proposal include (see Figure 1 below):

- Staged demolition and removal of the existing wharf, commencing with the eastern section, including the removal of the:
  - concrete wharf section
  - wharf deck and furniture
  - timber and concrete piles
  - utilities
- Construction of a new main wharf, up to 77 metres long by three metres wide, that is fixed and connected to the shore via walkways and infill micromesh
- Construction of a new three metre wide floating pontoon, up to 66 metres long, connected to a shore-side platform via a gangway with a landing platform
- Installation of a ten metre long lower-level landing, halfway along the main fixed wharf, with stairs connecting the landing to the main wharf and shore level
- Installation of berthing and mooring infrastructure and wharf furniture, such as fenders, bollards, safety ladders, rails and lighting
- Ancillary wharf services such as a new sewage pump-out facility and sewer connection, upgraded firefighting and power and water service pedestals
- Upgrade or repair of the seawall adjacent to the pontoon and placement of rock revetment along a 24-metre section, if required.



### Planned work for the Narooma Wharf

Construction of the works is proposed to occur over two stages to ensure that the wharf would remain operational during the construction period. Construction is expected to commence in the third quarter of 2022 and take around four months to complete. Construction work may not be continuous as it would rely on delivery schedules. Some prefabricated wharf components may be delivered to the site on barges.

## What's happening now?

TfNSW is seeking community feedback on the Review of Environmental Factors (REF), which is the planning document for the reconstruction of the wharf to ensure that we fully understand the local community's needs.

The REF will be on public display from **Monday 9 May until Wednesday 15 June 2022**.

Two public information sessions will be held, where you can drop in and talk directly to the project team. These will be held at the Narooma Sports and Leisure Centre at 100 Bluewater Drive at the following times:

- **Thursday 26 May 2022 from 6pm-8pm**
- **Saturday 28 May 2022 from 2pm-4pm**

The REF can be accessed at the drop-in sessions and in the following ways:
