

Transport Access Program Normanhurst Station Upgrade



The Normanhurst Station Upgrade is part of the Transport Access Program, a NSW Government initiative to provide a station that is accessible to people with a disability, limited mobility, parents/carers with prams, and customers with luggage. We thank you for your patience during this important work.

March work

Throughout March, work continues at Normanhurst Station where we will be:

- constructing the new lifts, including construction of new canopies on the platform
- upgrading the station platform waiting rooms, toilets and footbridge stairs.

Out of hours work

Saturday 12 March from 5am to 11pm on Sunday 13 March we will be working on:

- upgrading the signal and communications cables within the rail corridor
- regrading and resurfacing the station platforms
- installing an electrical padmount transformer and relocating a guard indicator within the rail corridor
- installing the new audio induction loop systems
- installing pipes to station footbridge

Temporary detour and footpath

A **temporary detour and footpath** is in place throughout **March to April** for commuters to access the station while work is carried out on the waiting rooms and refurbishment of toilets.

How will the work effect you?

Equipment used throughout March includes excavators, vacuum trucks, road saws, jackhammers, tipper trucks, concrete trucks with pumps, dump trucks, lighting towers, elevated working platforms, various hand and power tools.

Where possible, measures will be implemented to reduce noise and dust associated with this work, including adding shade cloth mesh to fencing, turning off equipment when not in use, placing equipment as far away as possible from properties and using non-tonal reversing beepers.
