More commuter parking at North Rocks is on the way

Transport for NSW is delivering approximately 135 additional commuter car parking spaces on the corner of Barclay Road and Perry Street to provide the community with more convenient access to public transport and reduce congestion on our roads. The car park is expected to be completed and open to the community by mid-2022.

The design of the new commuter car park

The design for North Rocks commuter car park includes:

- approximately 135 additional car parking spaces, to supplement the existing car park near Barclay Road
- landscaping in and around the car park area
- accessible car parking spaces

- lighting and wayfinding for improved safety and security
- Opal Park&Ride infrastructure (Opal operated boom gates).

What is happening in February?

Work is continuing on the new commuter car park in North Rocks.

Construction activities in February will include:

- · excavation and trenching work
- piling and sewer upgrade work
- construction of retaining walls
- in ground stormwater work
- stormwater and layback construction.

Equipment used during the work will include vacuum trucks, excavators, rollers, surveying equipment, a concrete pump, concrete trucks, construction vehicles, delivery and removal trucks and hand tools

Work on Perry Street

Work will progress on Perry Street. In February this will include the establishment of traffic control and a work zone around the entrance of the site to allow for the following work activities:

- excavation and trenching
- formwork, steel and concrete placement for new stormwater pits
- installation of stormwater pipes
- formwork steel and concrete placement for new entry layback and driveway.

Equipment used to complete the works include:

- 8t excavator
- general hand tools
- concrete saw
- concrete trucks
- vibratory compaction tools.

Night work in February

One occurrence of night work will be carried out in February, between **7pm** and **3am**, to install new electrical connections. This work will involve disconnecting, and removal, of the current electrical conduits and connecting new conduits.

We will notify nearby residents **one week prior** to this one night of work commencing.

Equipment used during this work will include an excavator, jackhammer, lighting and hand tools. Some of this work may be noisy, however we will aim to complete all noisy activities earlier in the night.

Our work schedule

In February, we will be on site from Monday to Friday between 7am and 6pm, and between 7am and 3pm on Saturday.

These extended weekend work hours will be in place for the duration of the project, or as per NSW Government Public Health Orders. We will contact you to advise if work is required outside of these hours.

How will our work affect you?

Our work may be noisy at times, however, wherever possible, we will put measures in place to reduce the impact of this noise including turning equipment off when not in use and using non-tonal reversing beepers for trucks used on the site.

Electrical power to the M2 bus stop will be temporarily affected by the night work in February, we will aim to mitigate this by using power generators.

Our work is in line with current Public Health Orders and a COVID Safety Plan is in place, including QR codes and masks.
