More commuter parking at North Rocks is on the way

Transport for NSW is delivering approximately 135 additional commuter car parking spaces on the corner of Barclay Road and Perry Street to provide the community with more convenient access to public transport and reduce congestion on our roads. The car park is expected to be completed and open to the community by mid-2022.

The design of the new commuter car park

The detailed design for North Rocks commuter car park has now been completed and includes:

- approximately 135 additional car parking spaces, to supplement the existing car park near Barclay Road
- landscaping in and around the car park area
- accessible car parking spaces

- lighting and wayfinding for improved safety and security
- Opal Park&Ride infrastructure (Opal operated boom gates)

What is happening in November?

During November, work will continue for the new commuter car park in North Rocks.

Construction activities in November will include:

- excavation and trenching work within the site
- service investigations and disconnections
- removal of redundant electrical services throughout site
- · removal of existing stockpiles
- tree removal work
- pole relocation work
- construction of retaining walls and stormwater system
- stormwater and sewer installation work

Equipment used during the work will include vacuum trucks, excavators, surveying equipment, chainsaw, chipper, concrete pump, construction vehicles, delivery and removal trucks, and hand tools.

Night work

Night work will be carried out during mid-November to install new electrical connections to poles. This work will take approximately onenight shift to complete and is not expected to be noisy.

Equipment to be used during this work will include lights and hand tools.

Nearby residents will be notified prior to the work.

Our work schedule

We will be on site from **Monday to Friday** between **7am and 6pm**, and between **8am and 1pm** on **Saturday**.

We will contact you to advise of any work required outside of these hours.

We are planning our work schedule over the next few months and would like to know if there are students living in the area who will be sitting the Higher School Certificate (HSC) examinations in 2021. If a member of your household is studying for the HSC, please advise us as soon as possible.

How will our work affect you?

Our work may be noisy at times, however, wherever possible, we will put measures in place to reduce the impact of this noise including turning equipment off when not in use and using non-tonal reversing beepers for trucks used on the site.

These works are in line with the current Public Health Orders and a COVID Safety Plan is in place, including QR codes and masks.
