Road works on Phillip Street and Lethbridge Street, St Marys from Monday 28 February

Transport for NSW will start construction to install two pedestrian crossings at the roundabout intersection of Phillip Street and Lethbridge Street (see map below). This work will improve safety and visibility for drivers and pedestrians, and traffic flow for heavy vehicles used in the construction of the St Marys temporary bus interchange and the Sydney Metro – Western Sydney Airport project.

The new metro railway line will service Greater Western Sydney and the new Western Sydney International (Nancy-Bird Walton) Airport. The city-shaping project will deliver new stations at St Marys, Orchard Hills, Luddenham, Airport Business Park, Airport Terminal and the Western Sydney Aerotropolis. The 23 kilometre new railway is planned to open at the same time as passenger services start at the airport.



What happens next?

Work will include the installation of raised pedestrian crossings, pedestrian fencing, the removal of concrete road islands, new road markings and upgraded street lighting. Utility adjustments, earthworks, and road works will also be completed.

Equipment used to carry out the works includes, but is not limited to; tipper trucks, vacuum trucks, excavators, rollers, a water truck, road sweeper and hand tools.

How will the work affect you?

There will be temporary traffic changes required during the work hours to ensure the work zone is safe. There may be times when we will detour traffic via Station Street, Queen Street and Blair Avenue. Please keep to speed limits and follow signs and traffic controllers' directions.

Access will be maintained to all properties at all times.

Our work schedule

Work will start on **Monday 28 February** and is expected to be complete in **early April**, weather permitting.

Our standard work hours will be **Monday to Sunday from 7am to 6pm**. On weekends, high noise activities will only occur on Saturdays between 8am and 1pm.

We will be on site for up to **night five** shifts. Our night work hours will be **Sunday to Thursday nights from 8pm to 5am**. We will complete noisier works by midnight, whenever possible. We will notify the community prior to starting night works.

Construction will be undertaken in accordance with Public Health Orders and a COVIDSafe plan is in place. Please note we may require some scheduling flexibility or additional days' work depending on weather conditions.
