St Marys temporary bus interchange

Update on road works February 2022

Works are underway by Transport for NSW to build a temporary bus interchange within the former Veness Place car park on Station Street to enable construction of the Sydney Metro – Western Sydney Airport. The temporary bus interchange will open in early 2022.

What happens next

We will continue general construction, road and drainage works in the area surrounding the temporary bus interchange (**see map below**). Various works will also be carried out at night to minimise traffic disruption.



Station Street works

Works will continue and include:

- installing a new stormwater drainage pipe along the southern side of Station Street between the temporary bus interchange entrance and Lethbridge Street
- constructing new asphalt pavement along the southern side of Station Street

Night works are planned to take place at this site from **Sunday 6 February** through to **Monday 7 March 2022.**

Traffic controls will be in place to prevent residents parking where work is taking place. We kindly ask residents and visitors to assist us by **not parking vehicles on the southern side of Station Street between 6pm and 6am Sunday to Thursday nights.** We thank you for your patience and understanding.

2 Temporary bus interchange

Works will continue and include:

- relocating and installing new underground utility services
- excavation works and ground surface levelling
- · concrete pours and asphalting

Night works are planned to take place at this site from **Sunday 6 February** through to **Monday 7 March 2022.**

3 Station Street truck equipment holding bay

We will be delivering equipment and materials to the laydown area located at 1a Station Street, adjacent to the existing bus interchange.

4 East Lane at Phillip Street

Works at this site started in late January 2022 and include:

- excavating the road and constructing a raised footpath
- road marking and installing signage

Night works are planned to take place at this site until Friday 11 February 2022.

5 Queen Street pedestrian crossing between Nariel Street and Station Street

Works at this site are planned to start on Friday 11 February 2022 and include:

- excavating the road and constructing a new raised pedestrian crossing with pram ramps
- installing new kerbing and guttering
- road line marking and installing signage

Weekend works are planned to take place at this site between Friday 11 February and Monday 14 February 2022. Traffic control will be in place on Queen Street during construction work and pedestrian access to Station Street and St Marys Station will be maintained. Vehicle access to Station Street and St Marys Station will be available via Phillip Street and Lethbridge Street.

Night works will continue to take place at this site until Monday 7 March 2022.

6 Phillip Street, Queen Street and East Lane asphalt works

Works at this site are planned to start on **Monday 7 February 2022** and include:

- excavating and removing existing asphalt and replacing with new asphalt
- road line marking and installing new signage

Night works will continue to take place at this site until Monday 7 March 2022.

What to expect

Equipment used for this work includes but is not limited to: vacuum excavation trucks, road-saws, jack hammers, bobcats (front-end loaders), excavators, rigid trucks, concrete trucks, rollers, water trucks, asphalt pavers and mobile cranes.

There will be temporary traffic changes during our work hours to ensure the work zone is safe. This may affect travel times. Please keep to speed limits and follow signs and traffic controllers' directions.

There will be minor traffic disruptions and an increase in light and construction vehicles throughout the period of works with traffic control measures in place. Access to driveways and buildings will be maintained but may be interrupted during night works. Utility services will be maintained and garbage collections and deliveries will be possible.

To minimise noise and dust impacts we have put in place the following measures:

- a work schedule that provides respite of 2 consecutive weekend nights Fridays and Saturdays – without any night works. However, due to the criticality of works to deliver the Queen Street pedestrian crossing, there will be 2 consecutive nights of respite on Wednesday 9 February and Thursday 10 February 2022, works will be undertaken between Friday 11 February and Monday 14 February 2022.
- installing construction fencing and shade cloth around the main construction site with regular hosing-down of sites to reduce dust.
- stopping noisier work, such as saw-cutting concrete or using hammer plates on road surfaces, at night by 10pm and using noise curtains, where feasible, for mobile or temporary works.



Our work schedule

Our standard work hours will be **Monday to Sunday from 7am to 6pm**. On weekends, high noise activities will only take place on **Saturdays between 8am and 1pm**.

Our night work hours will be **Sunday to Thursday nights from 8pm to 5am**. Night works will not take place on Friday or Saturday nights noting that weekend work will be undertaken between **Friday 11 February and Monday 14 February 2022** to deliver the Queen Street pedestrian crossing works.

These works will be undertaken in accordance with Public Health Orders and a COVIDSafe plan is in place. Please note that weather and site conditions may impact our planned dates of work and require some scheduling flexibility or additional days' work. We will continue to keep the community informed of construction plans and provide a project update in March 2022.
