Transport Access Program St Peters Station Upgrade



The St Peters Station Upgrade is part of the Transport Access Program, a NSW Government initiative to provide a station that is accessible to people with disability, limited mobility, parents and carers with prams, and customers with luggage.

Out of hours work in June

Work will be carried out around the clock from **7am Saturday 4 June** until **10pm Sunday 5 June**, and from **7am Saturday 25 June** until **10pm Sunday 26 June**. These activities have been scheduled to take place during Sydney Trains trackwork periods when no trains are running, minimising disruption to commuter services and improving the safety of our construction team and customers.

We will be:

- installing the new lifts, roofing and light poles on Platforms 1 and 2
- installing services and drainage into Platforms 1 and 2
- installing electrical equipment to the Station Manager's office
- installing containment pipes for services to the station footbridge
- installing screens and guardrails to the station footbridge
- installing handrails on all Platforms
- resurfacing Platforms 1 and 2.

Work schedules are subject to change due to permits, weather and site conditions.

What else are we doing in June?

Day works are continuing **Monday** to **Friday** from **7am** until **6pm**, and on **Saturdays** from **8am** until **1pm**.

We will be:

- installing platform tactiles. These will be installed during off peak train services. There will be a temporary yellow line on the platform edge and staff will be available to assist passengers to safely get on and off the train
- constructing the new lifts
- modifying the existing station toilets to become one family accessible toilet
- upgrading the Station Manager's office
- landscaping and upgrading the footpaths on Lord Street and May Lane adjacent to the station
- installing handrails and balustrades around the station
- installing in-ground electrical services and utilities at the Lord Street rail access gate.

What to expect

Intermittent periods of high noise - equipment used will include generators, trucks, gurney, circular saw, jack hammers, crane, compactor, excavator, and various hand and power tools. Measures to reduce noise will be implemented, including turning equipment off when not in use, positioning equipment as far away from residences

as possible, using non-tonal reversing beepers, and stopping work for respite periods.

Temporary parking restrictions - up to **eight car parking spaces around the Lord Street access gate** will be required to facilitate vehicle access. Up to three parking spaces either side of the Lord Street footbridge entrance will also be unavailable while landscaping work is carried out. Signage has been installed with dates of the parking restrictions.

Intermittent footbridge closures - access to the station from Lord Street and May Lane will be restricted at times. Access via Goodsell Street will remain open; Lord Street users can access the station via King Street / Princes Highway.

Increase in construction traffic - vehicles will access the rail corridor via Council Street, Concord Street and Lord Street rail access gates.
