Transport Access Program St Peters Station Upgrade



The St Peters Station Upgrade is part of the Transport Access Program, a NSW Government initiative to provide a station that is accessible to people with disability, limited mobility, parents and carers with prams, and customers with luggage.

Out of hours work in March

We will be working at the station on **Saturday 26 March and Sunday 27 March 2022**, between **6am and 6pm**. We will be:

- demolishing the top section of the platform on platforms 1 & 2 under the canopies, this involves using a circular saw and handheld jack hammers. The platform surface will be temporarily refinished with asphalt until the regrading and resurfacing of the whole platform is completed at a later date.
- installing new electrical connections for the existing light poles on Platforms 1 and 2
- accessing the rail corridor via Lord Street through the station.

This work will be carried out during a Sydney Trains trackwork weekend when trains are not running. For up-to-date information about bus replacement services during this time visit transportnsw.info or call 131 500.

Work schedules are subject to change due to permits, weather and site conditions. Notification will be provided should there be changes to the construction program.

What else we are doing in March

Standard working hours are **Monday to Friday 7am to 6pm and Saturday 8am to 1pm**. We will be:

- modifying the existing station toilets to become one family accessible toilet
- upgrading the Station Manager's office
- landscaping on Lord Street and May Lane running adjacent to the station leading to Princes Highway
- glazing and lift fit out on the platforms.

What to expect

- **intermittent periods of high noise** equipment used includes generator, work trucks, gurney, circular saw, jack hammers and various hand and power tools
- **temporary loss of parking** there may be a loss of up to eight car parking spaces around the Lord Street access gate to bring in vehicles. Signage will be installed ahead of the work if this is required.

Measures to reduce noise will be implemented, including turning equipment off when not in use, positioning equipment as far away from residences as possible, using non-tonal reversing beepers, and stopping work for respite periods. Thank you for your patience during this important work.
