

Wollstonecraft Station Upgrade

April 2022

Transport for NSW is upgrading Wollstonecraft Station as part of the Transport Access Program (TAP) to make it easier for everyone to access, including people with a disability or limited mobility, parents/carers with prams and customers with luggage.

Upcoming work in April

Work at Wollstonecraft Station will continue in April and will include:

- stormwater drainage work such as gutter and downpipe modifications
- bird proofing on cameras, lights and signage
- wayfinding signage installation
- removal and reinstatement of the footpath, kerb, driveway, and refuge island on Shirley Road and Telopea Street
- installation of fencing along the new kerb

- removal and reinstatement of line marking for the accessible parking and kiss and ride area
- electrical work to upgrade the power supply on Platform 2
- landscaping works
- defect rectification
- asbestos removal
- site compound demobilisation.

We will require the use of equipment including an excavator, dump truck, compactor, concrete vibrator, demolition saw, jackhammer, concrete truck, concrete pump and other powered hand tools to carry out these works.

Our work will be carried out in stages so access to the station is maintained. However, there will be some diversions in place for customers, accessing both Platform 1 and 2. Please follow the temporary signs and traffic controller's directions.

Safe work

Precautionary measures will be implemented to protect the health and wellbeing of our staff and the local community at all times. A qualified occupational hygienist will attend site to supervise any work where there is the potential to find contaminated materials. Personal protective equipment (PPE) including the use of protective suits may be used, as well as air monitoring equipment, water pumps and signage in line with the relevant legislation and other measures directed by the occupational hygienist.

Saturday extended hours

Extended work hours at Wollstonecraft Station will occur from **7am to 6pm** on the next three **Saturdays, 26 March and 2, 9 and April** for work to continue work on the footpath, kerb, driveway, and refuge island on Shirley Road and Telopea Street, fencing installation and the removal and reinstatement of line marking.

To facilitate these works, the parking and mail zone slip lane on Shirley Road will be barricaded off for the safety of our workers, pedestrians and motorists.

Some diversions will be in place for customers accessing Platform 1 and Platform 2. Please follow the temporary signs and traffic controller's directions.

Construction hours

Standard construction hours are **7am to 6pm Monday to Friday** and **8am to 1pm on Saturdays (except on 26 March and 2, 9 April)**.

Night work in April

For the safety of our workers, pedestrians, and motorists, electrical night work will take place in mid-April within the station. Impacted stakeholders will be notified ahead of time. There may be some noise associated with these works. While we expect this to be minimal, we will ensure every effort is made to minimise noise. We apologise for the inconvenience and thank you for your patience and understanding while we deliver this important upgrade.
