

Night detour on the Mitchell Highway at Vittoria between Bathurst and Orange on 27 June

The NSW Government is funding important safety work on the Mitchell Highway to provide a stronger, longer lasting and safer road as part of the Vittoria project.

Transport for NSW will carry out the work which includes installation of temporary barriers. A night-time detour will be in place during the work, and we have included a map to show the location of the work and the detour.

We will be working between **7pm** and **5am** on **Tuesday 27 June** and expect to complete this work over one night, weather permitting.

In the event of poor weather, the work will be carried out the following night.

How will the work affect you?

For the safety of motorists and our workers, this work will be taking place at night. There will be some noise and lighting associated with this work. We will make every effort to minimise noise by turning off machinery and vehicles when not in use and will direct lighting away from residences where possible.

Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe.

During work hours, all traffic will be diverted on the Mid Western Highway and Millthorpe Road via Blayney which will add an additional 15 minutes to travel times.

Access will be maintained for residents and emergency vehicles.

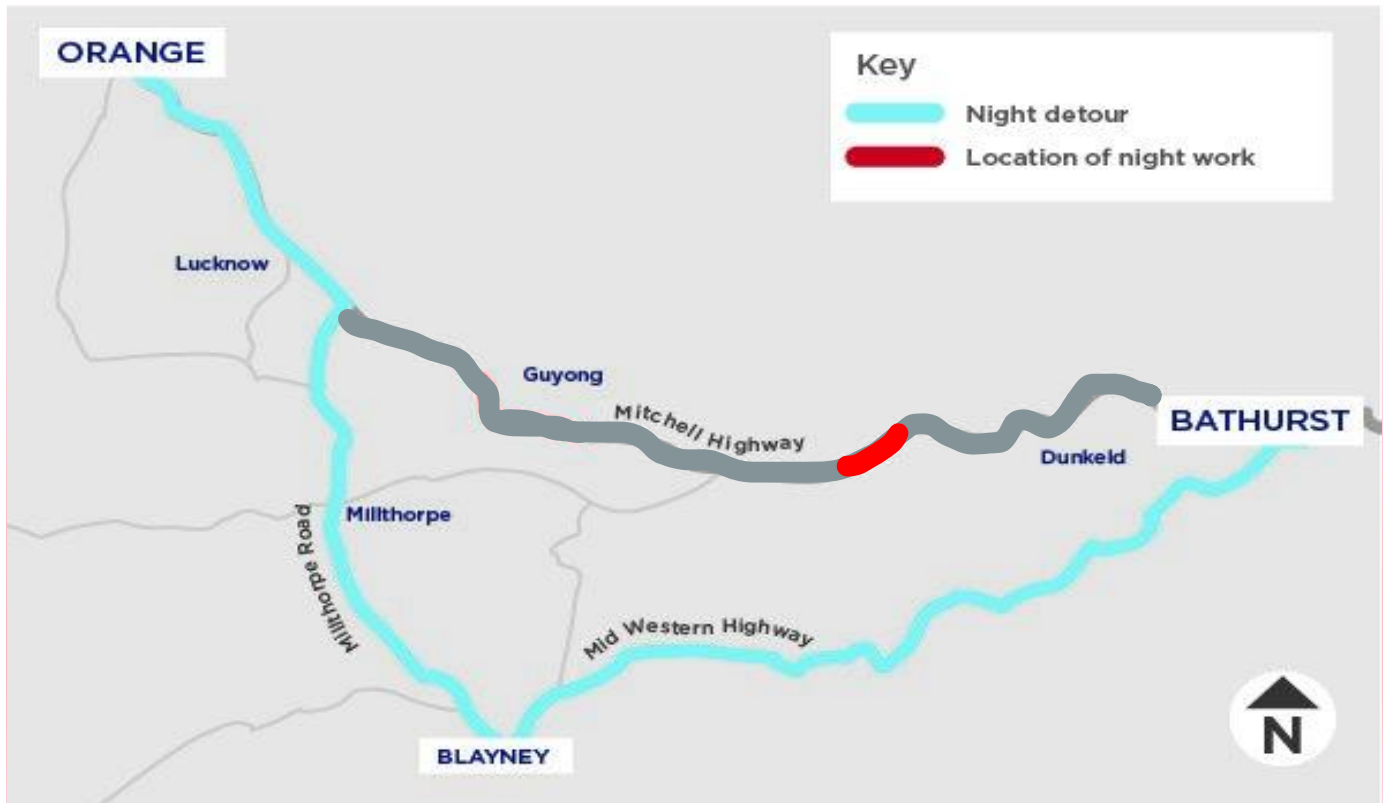
