### **Essential maintenance work**

# Essential maintenance work is taking place on the Great Western Highway near Mount Victoria.

#### What work are we doing?

This essential maintenance work includes repairing guardrail, carrying out inspections and general maintenance along the Great Western Highway.

#### When and where we'll be working

We will be working on the Great Western Highway near Mount Victoria. We have included a map to show the location of the work.

The work will take place outside of standard working hours for the safety of workers due to the proximity to highway traffic.

We will be working for one night from **8pm to 5am** on **December 16**, weather permitting.

#### What will this mean for you?

For the safety of motorists and our workers, the westbound lane of the Highway will be closed during the work with a detour in place via Chifley Road and Darling Causeway.

The eastbound lane will remain open at a reduced speed limit.

During the work you may also notice

- Noise from machinery and equipment
- Plant moving in and out of the project site
- Traffic control and signage in place

#### **Traffic changes**

The westbound lane of the highway over Mount Victoria will be closed during the work and eastbound traffic will have a speed restriction in place of 40km/hr.

A detour via Chifley Road and Darling Causeway will be in place for westbound traffic during this time. Westbound motorists are advised to allow an extra 15 minutes of extra travel time.

Access will be maintained for emergency services and local residents to the closure points at the bottom gantry. All road users are advised to follow the directions of signs and traffic control and slow down on approach.
