

Spring Farm Parkway Stage 1

Construction Update

Transport for NSW | April to June 2023

Project update

Work is advancing on Spring Farm Parkway Stage 1 and since our last update, we have completed the new concrete bridge pier foundation in the Hume Motorway median, excavated for the installation of four large drainage culverts within the project boundary and installed barrier protection under Mark Evans Bridge.

Widening of the median, drainage works and construction of the central bridge pier columns are in progress on the Hume Motorway. Road widening and utility relocations are also underway along Menangle Road.

What is happening next?

From April through to June, several key construction milestones will take place. Work scheduled over the coming months includes (weather permitting):

- continuation of bulk earthworks
- pavement and roadwork on Menangle Road
- installation of stormwater drainage
- construction of the new central bridge pier columns
- utility relocations within the project boundary
- temporary concrete barrier relocation on the Hume Motorway
- pavement widening in the Hume Motorway median
- construction of new roadside kerbing and guardrail

Temporary traffic changes within the project alignment

Traffic changes will be in place on Menangle Road while work is being carried out including temporary lane and shoulder closures. There will be intermittent stop/slow traffic control, temporary traffic barriers and reduced speed limits in place to guide road users.

To ensure the safety of workers and road users some changes to the speed limit within the construction areas are in place:

- **80km/h** on the **Hume Motorway**
- **40km/h** on the **Hume Motorway** during night work
- **60km/h** on **Menangle Road** outside of school zone hours
- **40km/h** on **Menangle Road** while work is being carried out near live traffic and/or night work.

Electronic signage will advise road users of these changes. Please keep to speed limits and follow signs and traffic controller's direction.

Upcoming evening and night work

From **Tuesday 4 April to Friday 30 June 2023** night work will be required in addition to work during standard construction hours to enable work on the Hume Motorway and Menangle Road.

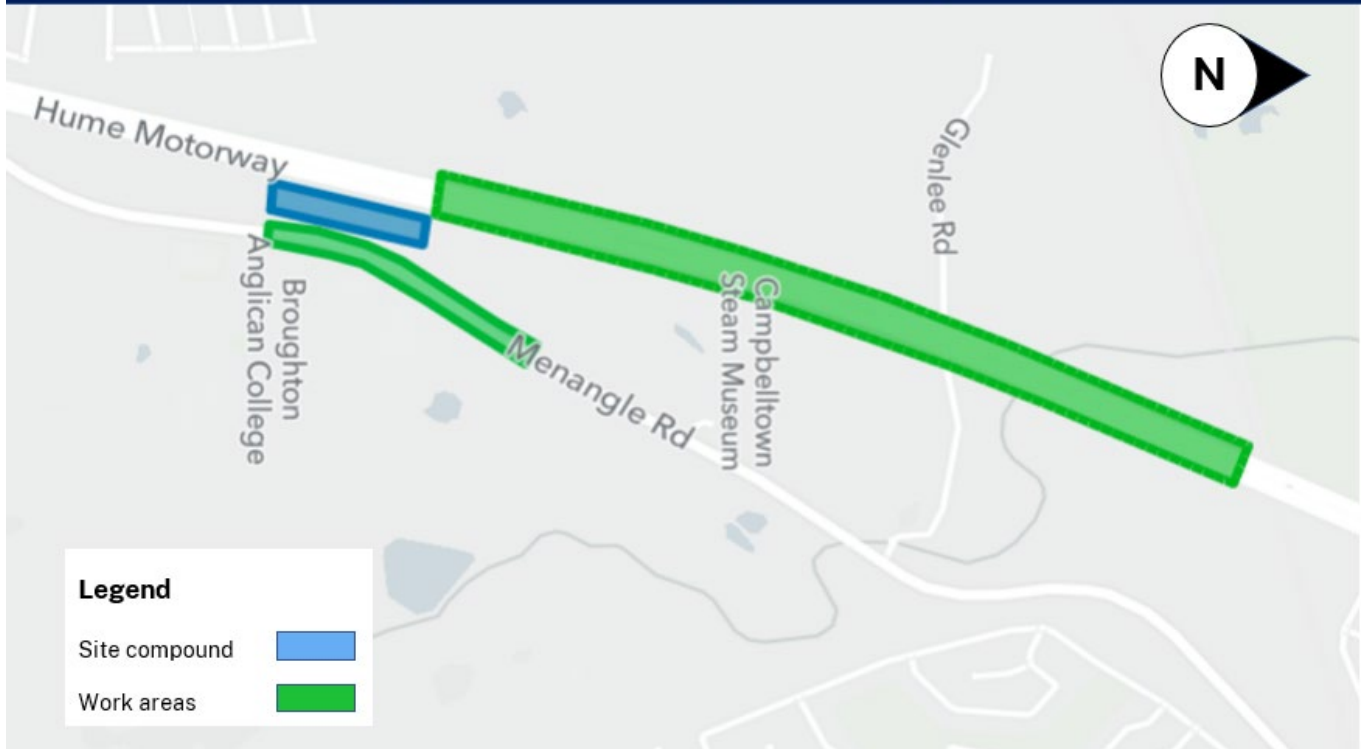
Night work will take place **between 6pm Tuesdays to 5am Sundays** with no more than five consecutive nights of work at one time.

Weather permitting, Table 1 provides a guideline of the proposed work activities, expected time frames and duration:

How will our work affect you?

Property access will be maintained to local residences, businesses and Broughton Anglican College. Should we need to limit access at any time, we will reach out to and work directly with the impacted stakeholders.

During our night work we may use machinery and equipment such as large trucks, cranes, elevated work platforms, light vehicles, lighting towers, rollers, line markers, excavators, profilers and asphalt paving machines.

The work may be noisy at times, and we apologise for any inconvenience this may cause.

Where possible we minimise noise and disruption by:

- turning off machinery when not in use
- completing high noise activities before midnight
- positioning equipment such as generators away from properties
- undertaking noise monitoring
- communicating over radio and hand signals
- using non-intrusive reversing alarms on all machinery.

Construction hours

Standard working hours are between **7am and 6pm Monday to Friday** and between **8am to 5pm on Saturdays**, excluding public holidays, weather permitting.

We will be working on Menangle Road during the April school holiday period between **1pm and 5pm on Saturdays** and between **8am to 5pm on Sundays** excluding public holidays, weather permitting.

Additional working hours will assist in completing works located near Broughton Anglican College. Works that may take place on **Sundays** will involve low noise level activities for minimal disruption.

At times work may take place outside of these hours, which will be notified for in advance.
