

Acknowledgement of Country

Transport for NSW acknowledges the traditional custodians of the land on which we work and live.

Many of the transport routes we use today – from rail lines, to roads, to water crossings – follow the traditional Songlines, trade routes and ceremonial paths in Country that our nation's First Peoples followed for tens of thousands of years.

1. What is the Alfred Street Cycleway Integration project?

The project will provide a continuous north-south cycleway along Alfred Street Parramatta. It will link the proposed cycleway on Alfred Street south of George Street to Alfred Street Bridge, which is currently under construction.

Key features of the project include:

- a dedicated two-directional cycleway between George Street and Noller Parade
- a raised bicycle and pedestrian crossing at Noller Parade to link the new cycleway to Alfred Street Bridge
- relocation of the Kiss and Ride zone to River Road West
- upgrades to street lighting, including new lighting poles and cycle lanterns
- new garden beds and tree plantings
- line marking adjustments.

2. When will construction begin?

Construction of the cycleway is expected to begin in late May 2023.

Some work will be completed in standard construction hours, between 7am to 6pm Monday to Friday and 8am to 1pm on Saturday.

For the safety of our workers, motorists, pedestrians and cyclists, and to minimise traffic disruptions, most of the work will, however, be carried out at night. Our night work hours will be from 8pm to 5am, Sunday to Thursday.

We will work up to five nights per week to get the work done as quickly as possible.

We will not work on Friday and Saturday nights, and no work will be undertaken during public holidays.

We will provide the community with another update closer to the start of construction.

3. What will construction mean for me?

During construction you may notice:

- workers and vehicles

- temporary changes to traffic, cycling, and pedestrian access
- temporary lighting
- noise and vibration from machinery and equipment.

We understand construction activities may cause disruption. We try to minimise construction impacts by:

- turning off equipment when not in use
- locating equipment as far away from residents and businesses as possible
- using noise blankets where possible
- completing noisy works before midnight.

Access to properties will be maintained at all times.

4. When will the project be completed?


The project will take approximately eight weeks to complete, weather permitting. We will update the community as the project progresses via community notifications, social media and webpage updates.
