Arncliffe Station Canopy Extension



What are we doing in Arncliffe?

Transport for NSW is extending the platform canopy at Arncliffe Station. The extended canopy will increase weather protection and encourage customers to use the full length of the platform to reduce crowding.

What happened last month?

During September we undertook electrical works in the station building, in-ground drainage works on the platforms and installation of structural steel and metal roofing for the new canopies.

What's planned next?

In October the following activities will be undertaken:

- Platform drainage work will continue
- Electrical and cabling work in the station building
- Brick planter boxes will be built on the platform

Stockpile will be removed from the site compound.

During this time equipment used will include hand tools, a plate compactor and electric scissor lifts.

An excavator and trucks will be accessing the site compound to remove the stockpile. A crane will be positioned within the rail corridor alongside Burrows Street and will be in use **between 7am to 3pm on Monday 4 October**. This will not affect the commuter carpark, but traffic control measures will be in place to manage traffic and for pedestrian safety.

When will construction take place?

To support the construction industry through the COVID-19 pandemic, the NSW Government has extended an amendment to the legislation regarding standard construction hours.

This amendment enables activities to be carried out between 7am and 6pm Monday to Sunday and public holidays.

Changes to the platform

Temporary fencing has been installed on the platform to create a safe exclusion zone for workers and customers. This has slightly reduced the platform width, and customers are urged to continue past these areas for their own safety and clearance purposes.

How are we staying safe?

In line with current Australian Government guidelines around slowing the spread of Coronavirus the site will have a dedicated Covid Marshall to ensure all people entering the site have been tested for Covid-19 and are safe to enter the site (as per current NSW Health guidelines).

Masks will be worn at all times, and where possible all work will be carried out at with a 1.5m physical distance and all necessary hygiene practices will be observed.

How do we consider the community?

The project team understands construction activities may cause some disruption for the community and we will seek to minimise impacts as much as possible.

When carrying out our work, the project team utilises a noise assessment of the programmed activities to determine the noise to be generated and the appropriate mitigation measures to be put in place. We will also continue to ensure we adhere to strict environmental conditions relating to vibration and dust management.

Thank you for your understanding and patience while we complete this important work.
