More Trains, More Services

The More Trains, More Services program is delivering platform extensions and rail asset upgrades between Sydney's CBD and the South Coast to support the introduction of the Mariyung fleet.

This fleet has been called 'Mariyung', the Darug word for Emu in acknowledgment of the local Aboriginal culture.

The new fleet will offer improved safety, accessibility, comfort and modern features for customers who make almost 45 million journeys a year on the electrified intercity network.

Thirroul

In the coming months, we will be completing our work inside the rail corridor between Thirroul Station and Thirroul Yard, which is approximately 500m north-east of the station. Our remaining activities are minor in nature and not anticipated to impact the local community. To facilitate access to our work areas, our construction team will utilise some parking spaces in the free car park off Church Street, Thirroul.

Wollongong and Coniston

Our work at Wollongong and Coniston will involve completing the installation of lights, placing concrete for the new driver walkways and excavating combined service route trenches for future cable routes.

At Coniston we will be completing overhead wiring work, installing new support footings and replacing overbridge safety screens.

Between 6am and 7pm Saturday 19 November 2022, sections of the outermost northbound and

southbound lanes on Bridge Street will be closed to facilitate safe removal of existing horizontal screens under the bridge, as indicated in the map below. New screens will be installed at a later date. Traffic control will be in place to assist motorists during this time.

To ensure the safe delivery of materials for the works at Coniston, we will require the use of approximately six car spaces on Miller Street as indicated in the map below. These spaces will be unavailable from **6am Monday 14 November until 6pm Friday 25 November 2022.**

Port Kembla and Port Kembla North

We will continue our work at Port Kembla North where we will be installing new lighting and CCTV, constructing new footings for the upgraded lighting, installing new and renewing old signalling infrastructure and system testing.

From 6am Monday 7 November until 7am Tuesday 22 November 2022, we will be reserving all commuter car spaces at Port Kembla Station to establish a temporary site compound and laydown area. Alternative parking is available in local streets east of the station.

Construction hours

Standard construction hours on these projects are **7am** until 6pm Monday to Friday and 8am until 1pm on Saturdays.

Upcoming night work

Between October and December, most of our work is scheduled to be carried out during standard construction hours, however some activities at Port Kembla North, Wollongong and Coniston Stations are required to take place outside of these hours.

We will be working at night between:

- 6pm Friday 30 September and 7am Tuesday 4 October 2022 at Port Kembla North Station
- 6pm Friday 18 November and 7am on Monday 21 November at Wollongong and Coniston Station.

This work has been scheduled to take place during Sydney Trains trackwork periods when no trains are running, minimising disruptions to commuter services and improving the safety of our construction team and customers. Some minor activities like site clean-up and deliveries may also be required to take place at night, however this work is not expected to impact the community. We will contact you directly if out-of-hours work is anticipated to be noticeable at your address.

All work and associated impacts, including parking impacts, are subject to approvals.

Minimising community impacts

We understand construction activities may cause disruption to our closest neighbours, and every effort will be made to minimise the impacts where possible, including conducting on-site monitoring to ensure compliance with strict environmental conditions relating to noise, vibration, and dust management.

Postponed or cancelled work

Due to a number of factors associated with work in the rail corridor, there is always a possibility that some of our planned work may be postponed or cancelled. We will keep you updated if any planned work is rescheduled.
