More Trains, More Services

The More Trains, More Services program is upgrading the rail network to support the introduction of the Mariyung fleet.

The Mariyung fleet will offer improved safety, accessibility, comfort, and modern features for customers who make almost 45 million journeys a year on the electrified intercity network.

As part of the program, we are extending platforms, upgrading infrastructure and re-building the maintenance shed at Dapto Station.

What's next at Dapto?

In June, work at Dapto will involve:

- construction of a new shed on Sydney Trains' land north of the main station entrance
- relocating existing accessible car parking spaces from the commuter car park
- installing new signal bases and underground services inside the rail corridor

- preparation work for the platform extension including earthwork and piling activities involving the use of vibratory rollers
- vegetation removal
- drainage work and relocating existing services.

Upcoming night work

In June, some activities are required to take place outside of standard construction hours between **6pm Friday 17 until 7am Monday 20 June**.

This work has been scheduled to take place during Sydney Trains trackwork periods when no trains are running, minimising disruptions to commuter services and improving the safety of our construction team and customers.

Minimising community impacts

We understand construction activities may cause disruption to our closest neighbours, and every effort will be made to minimise the impacts where possible, including conducting on-site monitoring to ensure compliance with strict environmental conditions relating to noise, vibration, and dust management.

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Standard construction hours

Standard construction hours on this project are **7am-6pm Monday to Friday and 8am-1pm on Saturdays.**

Temporary impacts to pedestrian access and commuter car spaces

Pedestrian access connecting platform 2 to the commuter car park has been restricted. A temporary pedestrian detour is in place and signage has been installed to assist pedestrians with these changes.

For improved safety, visual amenity, and dust containment, this area has been delineated with shade cloth and hoarding.

To enable the safe demolition of the existing maintenance building, we have also installed construction hoarding on platform 2. Access to the platforms will be maintained at all times and signage has been installed to assist commuters with these temporary changes.

To facilitate safe construction activity, we have temporarily:

- Relocated three accessible parking spaces to the front of the station and one adjacent to the pedestrian footpath in the commuter car park off Station Street
- Reserved six commuter car spaces for Sydney Trains staff members.

Alternate car parking is available:

- Off Bong Bong Road, approximately 60 metres south of Dapto Station
- Off Osborne Street, approximately 90 metres northeast of Dapto Station.

Some additional changes to parking may be required to enable safe site access for our construction vehicles. Signage will be installed to notify motorists and commuters of any upcoming changes.

Other projects in the area

Planning is currently under way to improve accessibility at Dapto Station as part of the Transport Access Program. This program aims to provide stations which are accessible to those with a disability, limited mobility, parents/carers with prams and customers with luggage.
