Start of Stage 2 works for Denmark Link Road from 17 April

Community update | April 2023

Stage 1 works are well underway on the Denmark Link Road Project, with Stage 2 works commencing Monday 17 April.

The main work is being delivered in five stages, with each stage taking between two to three months to complete with some overlap between stages. The work has been staged to lessen the disruption to the community and traffic. We are continuing our Stage 1 works building the new road between Carlton Street and Denmark Road and between Bridge Street and West Parade.

What are we doing?

From **Monday April 17**, we will be starting major work for Stage 2. This will include water and sewer adjustments, bulk earthworks and stabilisation.

We will also continue to upgrade Denmark Road and the new Denmark Link Road as well as a section of West Parade northwest of Bridge Street as part of our Stage 1 works. Temporary road closures will be in place.

We will carry out the following works:

- demolish the existing road pavement and replace it with new pavement
- construct new drainage systems
- construct new sewer and water mains
- construct new boundary fences

How will the work affect you?

Our work may be noisy at times, but we will do everything we can to lessen the disturbance to surrounding residents and businesses by using non-tonal beepers on reversing vehicles and turning off machinery when not in use. Equipment used for these activities include heavy and light vehicles, rollers, excavators, graders, bobcats and hand and power tools.

Our work schedule

We will be working between West Parade, Trevithick Street and Carlton Street from **Monday** 17 April as we continue upgrading the roads. This work will be carried out during the day.

Our work hours are **7am - 6pm Monday to Friday**. We are working towards finishing the Stage 2 works by July, weather permitting.

Traffic changes

Trevithick Street, part of Carlton Street and a southbound section of West Parade, will be closed for a period of 6-8 weeks from 17 April. There will be temporary changes to access for some residents. Burton Contractors will be in touch with you individually to explain the changes and how it will affect you. Access to residential properties and businesses will always be maintained.

Timed traffic lights will be in place to ensure safe flow of traffic and construction vehicles. Please follow the signs and traffic controllers' directions.
