

Doonside Station Upgrade Community Update

Transport Access Program June 2023





Transport for NSW acknowledges the Dharug people as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pay respects to Elders past and present.

What work are we doing in June?

Work includes:

- Civil, concrete, steel and glazing work to construct the new lifts, landings and canopies
- Refurbishment of footbridge
- Installation of platform canopy steel columns
- Installation of precast lift structure
- Excavating and trenching on Cross Street, and School Parade
- Landscaping and upgrading the footpaths and roads around the station
- Installing electrical and communication services
- Upgrading and cutover of station services.

When and where we'll be working

In June, work at the station will continue **Monday** to Friday from 7am until 6pm, and from 8am until 1pm on Saturdays.

Some activities may be required to be carried out outside of our standard work hours, including occasional out-of-hours deliveries.

What will this mean for you?

You may notice:

- At times there will be periods of high noise
- Temporary parking removal: at times, up to eight car spaces at the access gate (please see the map) on School Parade will be required to facilitate vehicle access.
- Temporary lane closure: throughout June, access to the station via Eastwood Lane (from

- Illoura Place) will be restricted at times to allow for paving and landscaping. Access will be maintained via Doonside Road.
- Occasional footpath closure: the footpath on Cross Street adjacent to the station entrance, will be restricted at times to allow for excavating and trenching. Traffic control will be in place to guide pedestrians around the work area.
- Increase in construction traffic: construction vehicles will access the rail corridor via the access gate on School Parade. At times, temporary parking removal will be required to provide access.
- Laydown areas: these secured areas on Coghlan Crescent and Rosenthal Street are required to store materials and support work outside the rail corridor.

Changes to scheduled works

Work schedules are subject to change due to permits, weather, and site conditions. Further notification will be provided should there be a significant change to the construction program.

Managing our effects

We aim to manage our work to avoid effects to the community and the environment. This includes:

- Reducing our noise as much as possible
- The use of noise blankets where possible, replacing reversing beepers with clickers
- Traffic control and signage will be in place
- Directional lighting pointed away from residential properties wherever possible.
