Night work on the Great Western Highway at Meadow Flat from Wednesday 26 April

The Australian Government and NSW Government are jointly funding the \$18.5 million safety upgrades on the Great Western Highway as part of the Kirkconnell Rehabilitation and Safety Works, approximately 30 kilometres east of Bathurst.

Transport for NSW will carry out the work which includes asphalting along a 1.8 kilometre section of the Great Western Highway near McManus Road. This work will facilitate the essential road safety improvements to widen the McManus Road intersection. We have included a map to show the location of the work.

We will be working between **7pm** and **6am**, Sunday to Friday from **Wednesday 26 April** and expect this work to be completed by the end of July, weather permitting. No work will be taking place during public holidays. We will let you know in advance if any work outside these times.

How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which generates some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise by turning off machinery and vehicles when not in use.

Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe.

Lane closures and a 40km/h speed limit will be in place during work hours and may affect travel times. Motorists should allow up to five minutes extra travel time during this work. Outside of work hours speed limits of 80km/h will be in place.


