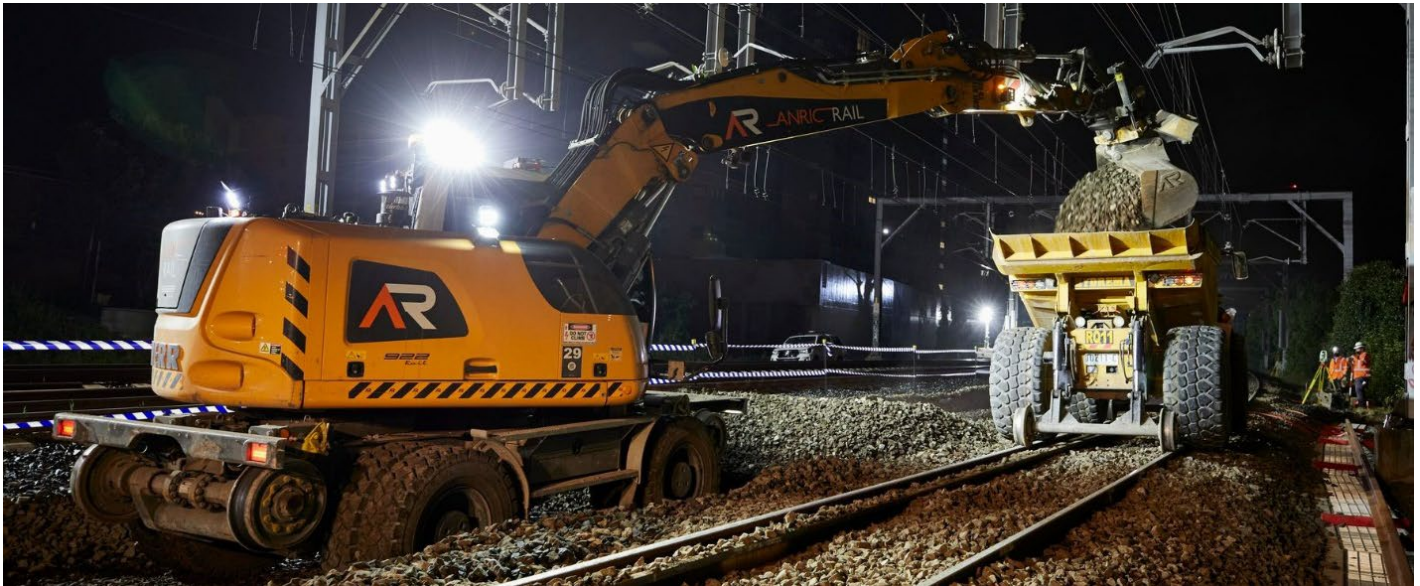


More Trains, More Services

Hurstville Crossover Project



What are we doing at Hurstville?

We are upgrading the rail infrastructure near Hurstville Station to allow trains to cross over from one track to another. This will mean that local services travelling away from the city can end their journey at Hurstville Station on Platform 4 and then start their return service to the city from Platform 3.

What's been happening?

Work to install new signalling infrastructure is currently underway, with further night shifts taking place inside the rail corridor on Monday 31 January, Tuesday 1 February and Wednesday 2 February. We have previously notified the community of these works.

What's planned next?

From Friday 4 February through to Sunday 6 February, night work will take place to test recently installed signalling infrastructure inside the rail corridor.

From Friday 18 February through to Monday 21 February, the new signals will be commissioned. We will also install new overhead wiring and rail infrastructure over this period.

When will construction take place?

To support the construction industry through the COVID-19 pandemic, the NSW Government has extended an amendment to the legislation regarding standard construction hours. This amendment enables activities to be carried out between **7am and 6pm Monday to Sunday and public holidays**.

Some out of hours work is planned. This work will take place during a scheduled Sydney Trains trackwork period when no trains will be running. Scheduling work during trackwork periods enables our construction team to complete essential activities safely inside the rail corridor.

- **10pm Friday 4 February to 6am Saturday 5 February**
- **10pm Saturday 5 February to 6am Sunday 6 February**
- **10pm Sunday 6 February to 6am Monday 7 February**
- **10pm Friday 18 February to 2am on Monday 21 February.**



Where will work take place?

The above maps show the work areas inside the rail corridor in Hurstville and the site access points. The site compound at Forest Road will be utilised for deliveries, storage of materials and equipment, pre-start work meetings and worker parking.

How are we staying safe?

We continue to deliver projects across NSW while ensuring the safety of all staff and the community. All work will be carry out in line with current Australian Government guidelines around slowing the spread of COVID-19.

How do we consider the community?

The project team understands construction activities may cause disruption for the community and we thank you for your patience as we carry out this work. We will adhere to strict environmental conditions relating to noise, vibration and dust management.

All work is dependent on weather and site conditions and is subject to change.
