| City of Canada Bay | New 'Heart' of Drummoynes Town Centre public square and one-way street trial | Formosa Street and Church Street, Drummoynes | This project created new public squares at the heart of Drummoynes – one at Formosa Street between Lyons Road and Bowman Street, and the other at Church Street between Victoria Road and Formosa Street. The closures of these areas were accompanied by new seating, landscaping and artistic elements, creating safer places for pedestrians and cyclists and, at Church Street Square, a space for cafes to offer outdoor dining to their customers. | Completed 2021 |
| City of Parramatta | Phillip Lane Activation | Phillip Lane, Parramatta | As extensive investment and change within the Parramatta CBD occurs at every level, this project created a new local hub. Elements like new art, lighting and greenery were installed within Philip Lane. | Completed 2021 |

This project brought activity to both Fairfield and Cabramatta town centres, including children's yoga classes, live DJs, public art and decorative lighting.
