

# Kingsford to Centennial Park Walking and Cycling Improvements

## Project Update

November 2023

The Kingsford to Centennial Park Walking and Cycling improvements project was developed by Randwick City Council. Transport for NSW has been delivering the project on behalf of Council since early 2022.

The work was funded as part of a \$240 million investment by the Australian and NSW Governments to help the economic recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic.

### Project Completion

We have been working hard to deliver the project and are pleased to announce that Transport for NSW and Burton Contractors have completed the work in Sections 1 and 2.

We will be finishing up on site at the **end of November**. More information on the staged opening and project completion is detailed below.

### Section 2 Opening

Transport for NSW and Randwick City Council are pleased to announce that Section 2, from Anzac Parade to Barker Street, will open on **Friday 10 November 2023**.

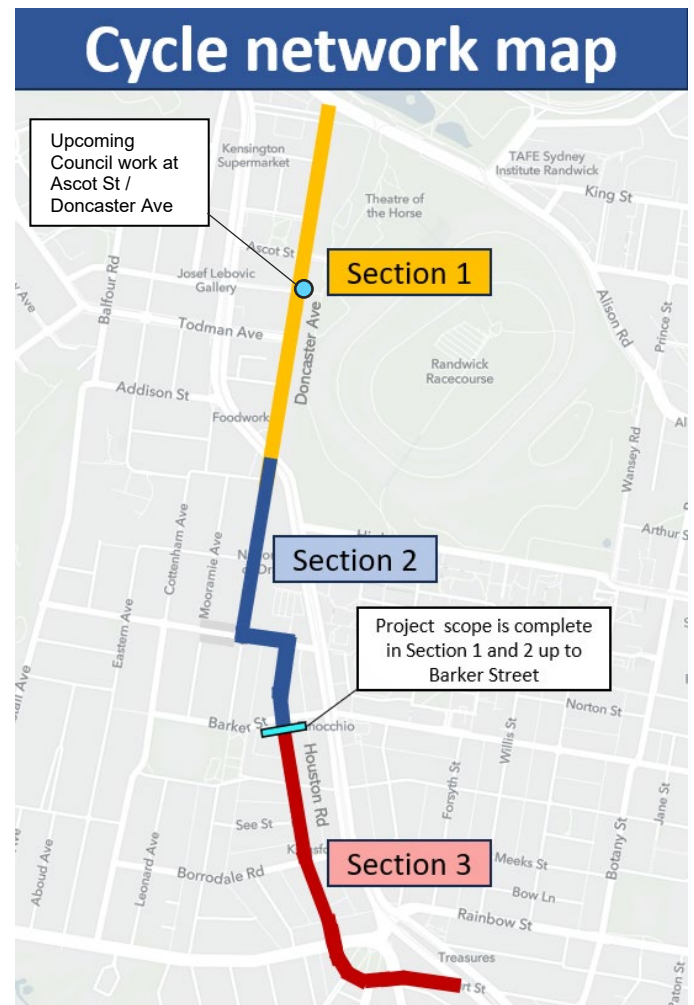
### Section 1 Update

Transport and Burton Contractors have completed work in Section 1.

However, Randwick City Council are continuing work in Section 1 at the intersection of Ascot Street and Doncaster Avenue. Section 1 will open after Council has completed their work towards the end of December.

This work will be undertaken by KK Civil from **8 November to mid-December 2023**.

## Section 3 Update

As mentioned in our August update, we have experienced many challenges during delivery of the project. As a result, Section 3 of the cycleway, from Barker Street to Sturt Street, will be completed at a later date.

Transport and Council will continue to work together to review the design options for Section 3 to deliver this important cycleway route.

We will keep the community updated.

### Transition at Section 3

The new separated cycleway finishes at Barker Street where there is a new raised pedestrian crossing (shown in blue on the map on page 1).

Bike riders will transition back to the existing on road marked cycleway. Signs and line marking will be in place to guide cyclists through this transition.

## Work to date and benefits delivered

Despite some challenges, we have delivered significant improvements for the community.

### Sections 1 and 2

Sections 1 and 2 will deliver 1.8km of separated cycleway to improve bike rider safety.

To improve pedestrian and road user safety we have:

- upgraded traffic signals at Todman / Doncaster Avenue intersection
- installed new raised pedestrian crossings at the Darling / Doncaster and Day / Doncaster intersections and two new pedestrian crossings at the Barker/ Houston intersection
- installed or upgraded 23 pram ramps to help people get around
- replaced 2500m<sup>2</sup> of concrete footpath and upgraded 48 driveways.

To improve safety and security at night we have:

- re-aligned and upgraded 22 streetlights
- installed eight new floodlights at the new pedestrian crossings.

To improve stormwater drainage and address flooding we have:

- installed over 780m of stormwater pipes, 75 stormwater pits
- replaced over 1000m of kerbs and gutters.

We have also reused 65m of existing sandstone kerb into the new cycleway.

## Removal of Compound sites

From early November, we will start to remove the site offices and compound from our location at Anzac Parade /Bass Street, Kingsford.

Following removal of the offices and compounds, the site will be returned to its original condition.

## Update on tree planting

Council will plant over 100 new trees in the local area on behalf of the Project. These trees are to replace the trees impacted by construction work.
