

# Update - Rescheduled water utility work - Kurnell

October 2023





Transport for NSW acknowledges the Gweagal and Bidjigal people as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respect to Elders past and present.

# What work are we doing?

As detailed in a previous notification, some of our upcoming activities include water and electrical connection work.

We have rescheduled our work due to delays in approvals and site conditions.

- From Friday 3 November we will start work to connect the water supply to the future Kurnell Wharf. This work is expected to take up to two weeks.
- A date for the short period of electrical connection work has not been confirmed.

Our water utility work will take place during our standard weekday hours **7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday**.

## Water connection work

- The work area is shown in green on the map over the page.
- We will be digging into the road and footpath on both sides of the road to access the watermain.
- We will install a new water pipe across the road near the corner of Captain Cook Drive and Prince Charles Parade.
- We don't anticipate any impacts to the general water supply.

## You may notice:

- fencing around the area where we are working
- equipment including excavators, vacuum trucks, trucks carrying ground material, and saw cutting tools
- temporary removal of around ten parking spaces during the work to help with traffic flow

- stop-slow traffic control for short periods of time for vehicles driving around the corner of Captain Cook Drive and Prince Charles Parade (for approximately one week of the work)
- higher levels of noise and vibration impacts during this work
- the bus stop and bus services will not be impacted during our work.

## Managing our impacts

#### **Remedial Action Plan**

- As part of our site Remedial Action Plan, bonded asbestos was identified within our water work zones and needs to be safely removed.
- We will be working within the guidelines of SafeWork NSW on the safe handling of this material.
- Safety measures such as signs and air monitoring will be in place for the duration of the utility work and removal.
- Removal will also commence in early November and take place Monday to Friday, 7am to 6pm.
- The asbestos removal is likely to take up to two days. We will liaise with adjacent properties.

#### During our work we will:

- maintain traffic and pedestrian access
- reinstate all areas once work is complete
- · install signs to notify parking removal
- carry out vibration and noise monitoring in line with the approved Noise and Vibration Management Plan.


