

Kamay Ferry Wharves

Update - Rescheduled work - La Perouse

September 2023



Transport for NSW acknowledges the Gweagal and Bidjigal people as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respect to Elders past and present.

What work are we doing?

As detailed in a previous notification, some of our upcoming activities include electrical and water connection work.

These works have been rescheduled to start in September, rather than August, due to delays in utility approvals and site conditions.

We plan to stage these utility works to maintain access for people walking and driving.

- From **mid – late September** we will start work to connect the water supply to the future La Perouse Wharf. This work is expected to take up to three weeks. Once the water pipe has been installed, Sydney Water will carry out final connections.
- We are also connecting electrical services to the wharf. This work is planned for **October**, following Ausgrid approvals, and will take around three weeks to complete.

We will work during normal daytime hours **7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday and 8am to 1pm, Saturday**.

Water connection work

- The work area is shown in green on the map over the page.
- We will be digging into the road and footpath to access the watermain.
- We will install a new water pipe from the roundabout along the grass on the Museum side of Anzac Parade and across the road.

You may notice:

- Fencing around the grassed area where we are working.

- A variety of equipment including excavators, vacuum excavator trucks, and trucks carrying spoil and ground material.
- We will temporarily remove five parking spaces at different times during this work.

Electrical connection work

- The work area is shown in blue on the map over the page.
- We will open a series of ‘pits’ along the footpath to connect to the power network.

You may notice:

- A variety of equipment including vacuum excavators, small compaction and equipment, and material delivery trucks.
- We will temporarily remove two parking spaces at different times during this work.

Wharf approach structure

- As detailed in the community notification sent last month, we will also be starting to build the wharf approach structure and carrying out rock excavation work in the next week or so.
- The approach structure will connect the landside pathway to the new wharf.
- The rock excavation work will take up to two weeks to complete.

Managing our impacts

Remedial Action Plan

- As part of our site Remedial Action Plan, there are small fragments of bonded asbestos within our work zones that need to be safely removed.
- We will be working within the guidelines of SafeWork NSW on the safe handling of this material.
- The removal will commence in September and continue during various stages of the project.
- The asbestos removal is likely to take up to 2 days for removal and signs will be in place. We will also liaise with adjacent properties.

Electrical and water connection work

During our work we will:

- contact you if there are any temporary impacts to your electrical or water supply
- maintain traffic and pedestrian access
- reinstate all areas once work is complete
- install signs to notify parking removal
- carry out vibration and noise monitoring in line with the approved Noise and Vibration Management Plan.
