Removal of viewing platform at Kurnell

July 2023





Transport for NSW acknowledges the Gweagal and Bidjigal people as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respect to Elders past and present.

What work are we doing?

From **Monday 10 July 2023** we will start work to remove the existing viewing platform at Kurnell where the new wharf will be constructed.

This work will take around three weeks to complete. The work will be intermittent and dependent on weather and tidal conditions.

The works will take place during our normal daytime hours **7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday and 8am to 1pm, Saturday**.

What will the work involve?

We will remove the existing viewing platform by taking it apart in sections, in a planned and organised sequence. In this case we will work from the deck level down including the supporting timber piles.

The removal of the structure will be undertaken using a 150 tonne, land based mobile crane. The removed sections will then be loaded onto trucks and recycled.

What will this mean for you?

Some work will be noisy, such as the use of chainsaws to cut through sections of the timber parts of the structure, and the use of a hydraulic vibration extractor to remove the piles. The use of these types of equipment will be very limited.

The noise level experienced by people will depend on how close you are to the work area. Given the vicinity of the viewing platform to local residences and businesses, it is not expected that there will be any noise impact from this activity.

Noise monitoring will be carried out during the work and in accordance with the approved Noise and Vibration Management Plan.

This will ensure we comply with the assessed impacts of our work and help minimise any impacts to our neighbours.

Safeguarding the environment

Floating silt curtains will be used around the structure to ensure that all materials are captured and removed.

The removal of the piles will mainly be done at low tide to minimise marine impacts.

Wherever possible materials will be unbolted to separate them to minimise noise and possible sawdust.

Most removed material will be either recycled or repurposed within the National Park (ie. the existing information panels).
