


Essential maintenance work on Kidman Way bridge over Benerembah Channel from Monday 26 June

The NSW Government is funding this work to provide a safer and stronger bridge for transport customers.

What we're doing

Transport for NSW is carrying out essential maintenance work on the Kidman Way bridge over Benerembah Channel. Strengthening work will be carried out underneath the structure. This work will ensure the bridge remains safe and continues to service the community while we continue to plan for a replacement bridge.



We'll be carrying out work weekdays from **Monday 26 June** between **7am and 6pm**. Work is expected to take **six weeks** to complete, weather permitting.

How the work affects you

The work will involve the use of machinery which generates some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise by arranging the work in stages at different locations and turning off machinery and vehicles when not in use.

Traffic changes

From Monday 26 June to Friday 4 August, there will be changed traffic conditions on the bridge between 7am and 6pm. Reduced speeds will be in place for the safety of the workers, and single lane closures will be required occasionally to allow a crane to safely install support beams. Motorists are advised to follow the direction of traffic control and reduce speeds while passing the work site.

During these single lane closures, oversize and overmass vehicles wider than five metres will need to contact traffic control via UHF 13 so the project team can ensure safe access on the bridge.

Traffic conditions will return to normal outside of work hours.

Motorists are advised to allow up to five minutes extra travel time to their journey for the duration of the project.

Planning for a new bridge

Work to replace the bridge is continuing with planning under way. The project includes replacing the irrigation bridge and upgrading the Kidman Way intersections with North Kooba Settlers, Pellizzer, Waide and Marston roads.

The community consultation report and concept designs are being finalised. We will keep the community informed of any updates as the project progresses.
