More Trains, More Services

The More Trains, More Services program will simplify and modernise the rail network. To improve train services for customers on the south coast, platform extensions and asset upgrades are required at several stations along the T4 Illawarra Line.

In the coming months, we will be completing work in and around the rail corridor to support the introduction of the new Mariyung fleet which will provide a new level of comfort and convenience for intercity customers.

What's happening at Kembla Grange?

- Completing site investigation works
- completing cable work and electrical upgrades to support the installation of additional rail infrastructure and improved rail services
- replacing almost 2 kilometres of overhead wiring between the Kembla Grange Substation and Mullet Creek rail bridge
- removing old and erecting new overhead wiring structures and footings
- trenching for underground cable containment
- upgrading the access platform at Kembla Grange Substation
- installing new galvanised steel troughing (GST) and direct current feeder cables
- constructing a new GST access bridge over an existing stormwater culvert approximately 50 metres northeast of Kembla Grange Substation.

What's next?

In the coming months, we will start main construction activities inside the rail corridor, stretching from Kembla Grange Substation to Mullet Creek rail bridge. Upcoming activities will include:

- de-vegetation at the substation to facilitate the installation of GST
- trenching for new cabling inside the rail corridor
- establishing a temporary site compound and laydown areas within the rail corridor
- non-destructive digging activities to locate servicing routes

Vegetation removal

All vegetation removal will be offset in accordance with Transport for NSW's Vegetation Offset Guidelines which aims to replace 100% of all native vegetation.

Site compound establishment

A site compound is required to be established inside the rail corridor southwest of the substation and will be operational during standard construction hours, for approximately 4 week periods over the next 12 months. The compound will be used for office sheds and material storage and accessed via existing Sydney Trains access gates on West Dapto Road, the Kembla Grange Station commuter car park and the Princes Highway.

Standard construction hours

Standard construction hours on this project are: 7am-6pm Monday to Friday and 8am-1pm on Saturdays.

Some deliveries and other minor activities may be required to take place outside of standard construction hours. We will contact you directly if out of hours work is anticipated to be noticeable at your address.

Level Crossing Closure – Detour via Darkes Road

The vehicle level crossing on West Dapto Road will be temporarily closed between **Saturday 4 and Sunday 5 March 2023**.

This will enable the construction team to safely remove overhead wiring structures and cables.

A detour will be in place via the Princes Highway, Darkes Road and West Dapto Road for motorists wanting to access Reddalls and Wyllie Roads, as indicated in yellow, below.

Postponed or cancelled work
