Sydney Terminal Area Reconfiguration Project – Erskineville

Transport for NSW | April and May 2022

What are we doing?

We are upgrading the rail infrastructure between Sydney Terminal and Erskineville Junction to simplify and modernise the rail network so that customers can expect more frequent train services in the future.

What's been happening?

Some signalling work was carried out inside the rail corridor in March. Other planned work activities, including electrical, overhead wiring and track work, were postponed due to unforeseen circumstances. We will let you know once these works have been rescheduled.

What's planned next?

During April and May we will carry out the following activities:

- Installation of cables and a steel conduit on Sydney Trains land at the end of Burren Street near Macdonaldtown Station. Please refer to the map overleaf for more information
- Installation of new electrical, signalling and overhead wiring infrastructure
- Deliveries of infrastructure and materials.

All work is dependent on weather and site conditions and is subject to change.

When will work take place?

The standard construction hours for the project are:

- **7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday**
- **8am to 1pm on Saturdays.**

We will notify you in advance of any planned out of hours work.

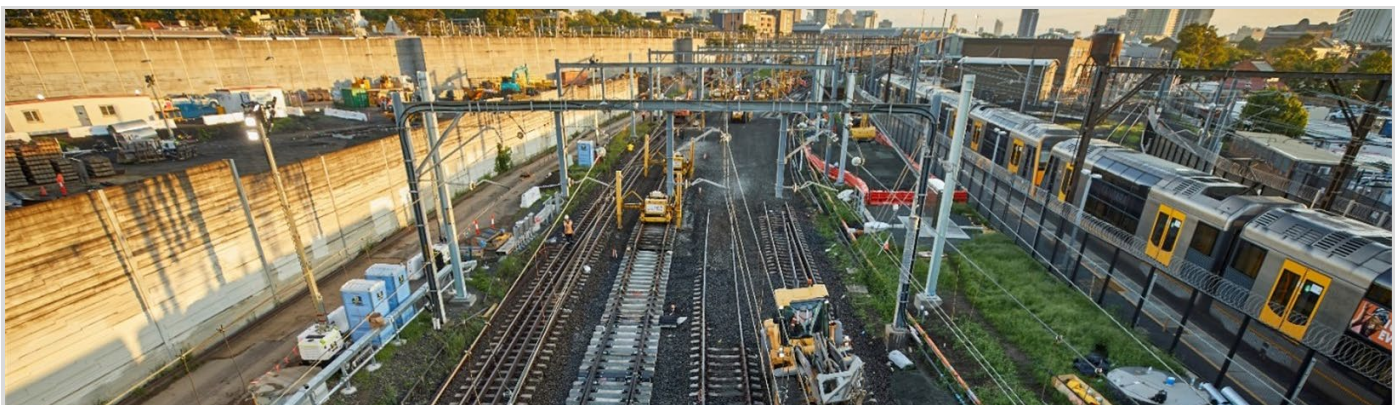
Upcoming out of hours work

Some work will take place outside of standard construction hours from:

- Between **2am Saturday 14 May to 2am Monday 16 May**
- Between **2am Saturday 21 May to 2am Monday 23 May.**

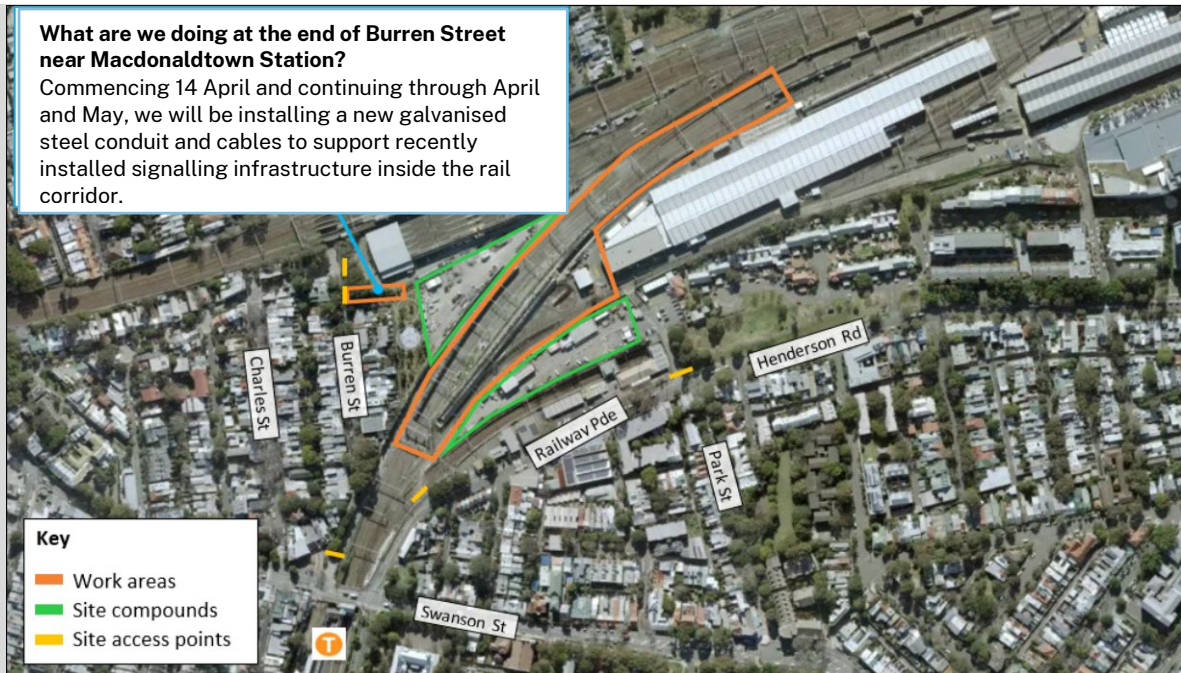
This work will take place during scheduled Sydney Trains trackwork periods when no trains will be running. Scheduling construction work outside of standard construction hours enables our project team to complete essential activities safely.

Throughout April and May there may also be overnight deliveries to our site compounds. Further updates will be provided in advance of the overnight deliveries.



What are we doing at the end of Burren Street near Macdonaldtown Station?

Commencing 14 April and continuing through April and May, we will be installing a new galvanised steel conduit and cables to support recently installed signalling infrastructure inside the rail corridor.



Where will work take place?

The above map shows the work areas inside the rail corridor and our site compounds. The site access points are on Swanson Street, Railway Parade and Burren Street.

The project team will continue to utilise the site compounds for deliveries, storage of materials and equipment, offices, pre-start work meetings and worker parking.

How do we consider the community?

The project team understands construction activities may cause disruption for the community. We will seek to minimise impacts as much as possible and adhere to strict environmental conditions relating to noise, vibration and dust management.

How are we staying safe?

We continue to deliver projects across NSW while ensuring the safety of all staff and the community. All work will be carry out in line with current Australian Government guidelines around slowing the spread of COVID-19.
