Sydney Terminal Area Reconfiguration Project - Erskineville



What are we doing in Erskineville?

We are upgrading the rail infrastructure between Sydney Terminal and Erskineville Junction to simplify and modernise the rail network so that customers can expect more frequent train services in the future.

Where is the project up to?

Work has been underway since June 2020 and over the December 2021 holiday season, the project team reached a major milestone. Following 18 months of investigation and installation work, the team successfully commissioned new signalling infrastructure within the rail corridor over a five-day period.

The photo above shows one of the newly commissioned signals, which is integral to passing information to train drivers.

What's planned next?

In February 2022 we will install overhead wiring and electrical infrastructure inside the rail corridor and at the substation located within our site compound.

The project team will also continue to utilise the site compounds for deliveries, storage of materials and equipment, offices, pre-start work meetings and worker parking.

When will construction take place?

To support the construction industry through the COVID-19 pandemic, the NSW Government has extended an amendment to the legislation regarding standard construction hours. This amendment enables activities to be carried out between 7am and 6pm Monday to Sunday and public holidays.

Some out of hours work is planned. This work will take place during a scheduled Sydney Trains trackwork period when no trains will be running. Scheduling work during trackwork periods enables our construction team to complete essential activities safely inside the rail corridor.

- 6am to 6pm on Saturday 19 February
- 6am to 6pm on Sunday 20 February

We are also expecting some machinery to be delivered to our compound adjacent to Railway Parade at night on **Friday 18 February between 6pm and 10pm.** This machinery will be unloaded after 7am on Saturday 19 February.



Where will work take place?

The above map shows the work areas inside the rail corridor and our site compounds. The site access points are on Swanson Street and Railway Parade.

All work is dependent on weather and site conditions and is subject to change.

How do we consider the community?

The project team understands construction activties may cause disruption for the community. We will seek to minimise impacts as much as possible and adhere to strict environmental conditions relating to noise, vibration and dust management.

How are we staying safe?

We continue to deliver projects across NSW while ensuring the safety of all staff and the community.

All work will be carry out in line with current Australian Government guidelines around slowing the spread of COVID-19.
