Thirroul, Bellambi and Kiama Platform Extensions

What's been happening?

Work has been continuing along the south coast rail line as part of the More Trains, More Services program.

The program is delivering platform extensions and asset upgrades between Sydney's CBD and the South Coast to support the introduction of the new Mariyung train fleet.

This important work will simplify and modernise the rail network and provide an improved level of comfort and convenience for intercity customers.

Thirroul, Bellambi and Kiama stations are receiving platform extensions to support the introduction of the new 10 car Mariyung and enable customers to board the train safely.

In May, we continued preparation of these sites for major construction milestones scheduled to be carried out in June.

What's happening next?

In June, we will be completing some construction activities at night, outside of standard construction hours (7am-6pm).

These activities have been scheduled to coincide with Sydney Trains track work periods, when no trains are running. Sections of the tracks are closed so our construction team can work safely and efficiently while upgrading the track and surrounding infrastructure.

Night work at Bellambi, Kiama and Thirroul

In addition to working during standard construction hours, we will be completing night work in the rail corridor at Bellambi, Thirroul and Kiama stations between:

- **midnight and 7am Saturday 5 June at Bellambi**
- **10pm Friday 18 and 2am Monday 21 June at Kiama**
- **10pm Friday 25 and 2am Sunday 28 June at Thirroul and Bellambi.**

Standard construction hours

To support the construction industry through Coronavirus, the NSW Government have extended an amendment to the legislation regarding standard construction hours. This amendment enables activities across all our sites to be carried out between 7am and 6pm on weekdays, weekends and public holidays.

Temporary parking changes at Thirroul

To enable the safe movement of a crane and storage of construction materials, we will be reserving approximately 40 car parking spaces at Thirroul commuter car park off Railway Parade, west of the station from **7am Monday 21 June until 5am Monday 28 June.**



From **7am Wednesday 23 June until 5am Monday 28 June** we will reserve an additional 47 car parking spaces at Thirroul, including:

- 9 spaces off Station Street
- 6 spaces in the eastern commuter car park
- approximately 30 spaces off King Street.

These areas are required to support the construction works as they are adjacent to corridor access gates and will enable safe delivery of heavy machinery and construction materials.


Our traffic controllers will install signage in advance to reserve these spaces and advise motorists of these temporary changes.

The images on the following page indicate the car parking spaces which will be temporarily unavailable for use.

Impacts to 9 spaces off Station Street and 6 spaces in the eastern commuter car park:

Temporary parking changes at Kiama

At Kiama, we will require the use of 32 commuter car parking spaces between **7am Wednesday 23 June until 5am Monday 28 June** for the safe delivery of heavy machinery and equipment.

We will temporarily reserve 17 spaces south of the station and 15 spaces north of the station, as indicated in the images below.

Our traffic controllers will install signage to reserve these spaces and advise motorists of these temporary changes.



Temporary parking changes at Bellambi

At Bellambi, we will require the use of 10 commuter car parking spaces between **7am Wednesday 23 June until 5am Monday 28 June** for the safe delivery of heavy machinery and equipment, as indicated in the image below.



Minimising impacts

The project team understands that construction activities may cause disruption for the community and every effort will be made to minimise impacts where possible, including:

- turning off equipment when not in use
- using non-tonal reversing alarms to reduce potential noise impacts to the surrounding community
- locating equipment as far away from residents and businesses as possible
- directing lighting away from residents
- conducting on-site monitoring to ensure compliance with strict environmental conditions relation to noise, vibration and dust management.

We thank you for your patience while we carry out this important work.

How are we keeping our sites safe?

We are continuing to deliver projects across New South Wales while ensuring the safety of all staff and the community. In line with current Australian Government guidelines around slowing the spread of Coronavirus and social distancing, all work will be carried out at a safe physical distance where possible and necessary hygiene practices will be observed.
