



# More Trains, More Services

Mascot Precinct Upgrade projects



## What is happening in Mascot?

Transport for NSW (TfNSW) is constructing two projects within the Mascot precinct as part of the More Trains, More Services program.

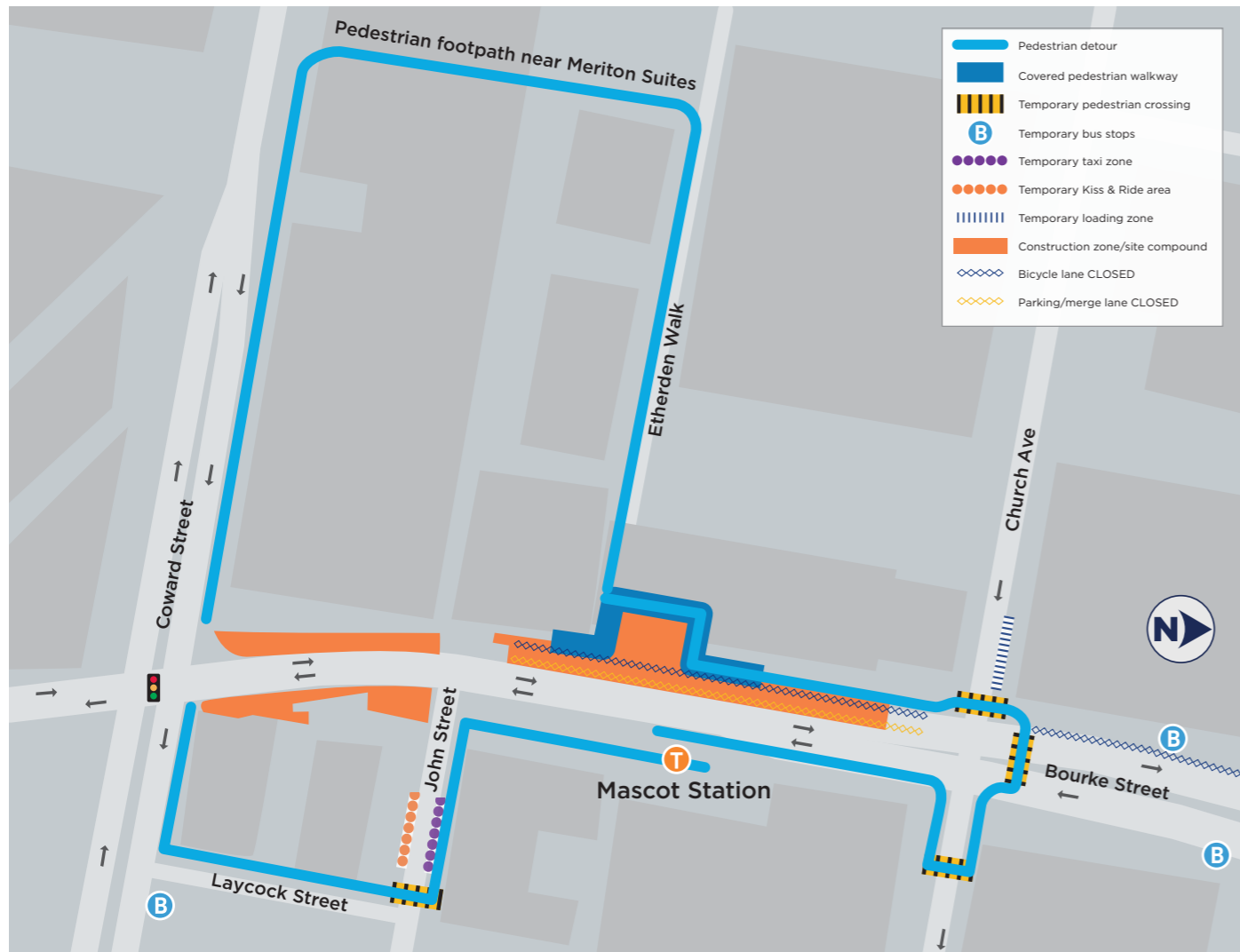
Over the last few weeks, you will have noticed a number of changes around the precinct as we continue to build a new station entrance on the western side of Bourke Street, opposite the existing station entrance. Some changes have also been made necessary to continue with the construction of our new substation at 166 O’Riordan Street, and the underground power supply cable route connecting the electrical substation to the train station on Bourke Street.

Last month we closed the footpath on Bourke Street between Coward and John streets, and introduced a pedestrian detour through Laycock Street to allow residents and commuters to move around the precinct in a safe manner. This month, we have removed the pedestrian crossing near Mascot Station and introduced a temporary detour using parts of Church Street to allow pedestrians to cross Bourke Street safely. Please see map overleaf which details these pedestrian detours.

We have moved the pedestrian crossing on John Street to be closer to Laycock Street to increase pedestrian safety, as well as made changes to the locations of the taxi, kiss and ride and loading zones.

We have also increased the amount of fencing on our project sites to ensure we can complete our work safely.

We acknowledge the inconvenience these detours and changes are causing, and thank you for your patience as we continue this important work. Our traffic management plans will continue to develop as our projects move further into construction. We will always look for ways to improve amenity and safety for pedestrians within the area. We will shortly introduce a signalised pedestrian crossing on Bourke Street, near John Street, which will remove the need to detour using Church Street. Both the Church Street pedestrian crossing and the soon-to-be built crossing on Bourke Street near John Street will remain in place for the duration of the project.



## We will be working outside standard hours in June

Our standard construction hours on our projects are **7am and 6pm on weekdays, weekends and public holidays**.

To ensure safety of pedestrians, construction workers and to minimise the impact to traffic, we have scheduled some work to be completed outside of standard construction hours. We will be working at night, between 6pm and 7am, on the following dates:

- Friday, 11 June and Saturday 12 June
- Friday, 18 June and Saturday 19 June
- Wednesday 23 June and Thursday 24 June

Our activities during this night work will include the installation of hoardings, relocating utility services on Bourke Street, installing barriers around the site compound and road works.

We will also be working up to five night shifts between **6pm and 7am between Monday 21 June to Friday 25 June** to complete the installation of survey markers in the road corridor on O’Riordan Street, Bourke Road and Bourke Street.

Completion of work scheduled outside of standard construction hours is dependent on weather and site conditions and is subject to change.

Our work may be noisy at times. Every effort will be made to minimise impacts where possible including traffic control and signage for vehicles, pedestrians and cyclists. We will also turn off vehicles and equipment when not in use, use noise barriers, and work in shifts to provide respite from noisy activities.

We will be contacting residents directly who may be impacted. We thank you for your patience while we complete this important work.

## What’s planned next for the Station Access Upgrade?

Work will continue in June and includes:

- ongoing relocation of utilities including water, sewer, electricity, telecommunications, and locating existing services on Bourke Street
- constructing the new site compound including site sheds, fencing and hoarding around the site
- construction of a piling platform
- mobilisation of piling equipment

Equipment to be used includes excavator, crane, forklift, generator, tipper truck, saw cutter, trucks, non-destructive digging (NDD) truck, and powered hand tools.

## Constructing a new site compound

From the beginning of June, we will begin setting up our site compound and construction site on Bourke Street.

This work is expected to take around two weeks, and will be in place until the end of the project (expected late 2022).

## What’s planned next for the Power Supply Upgrade?

During May, we started piling work and installed site sheds in our compound on Bourke Street. We also completed modifications to the road alignment on Bourke Street between Coward and John streets.

Construction activities continue in June and include:

- piling and building foundations (including excavation, in-ground services and concrete work) at the substation site at 166 O’Riordan Street
- piling work on the western side of Bourke Street
- installation of survey markers on Bourke Street and O’Riordan Street.

We note, some concrete deliveries may arrive late in the afternoon to the site compound. If this occurs after 6pm, we do not expect this work to be noisy.
