

Mamre Road upgrade

What does the Mamre Road upgrade involve?

The NSW Government is planning to upgrade Mamre Road to reduce congestion, improve safety and travel times and support future economic and residential growth in the area.

This upgrade would provide an improved link between the M4 Motorway in the north and Elizabeth Drive in the south. Elizabeth Drive would connect to the future M12 Motorway, which is expected to open in 2026 and would provide the main road access to the Western Sydney Airport.

Mamre Road is currently a two-way, state road connecting Elizabeth Drive in the south, and the Great Western Highway in the north. To continue supporting the growth of Western Sydney, Mamre Road is proposed to be upgraded to four lanes with provisions to six lanes in the future.

What are the key features of this upgrade?

Features of the Mamre Road upgrade between M4 Motorway and Erskine Park Road include:

- an upgrade to 3.8 kilometres of Mamre Road between the M4 Motorway, St Clair and Erskine Park Road, Erskine Park to a four-lane divided road with a wide central median, allowing for six lanes in the future if required
- changes to intersections with Mamre Road including:
 - an upgrade to the existing signalised intersection at Banks Drive including a new western stub for access and a U-turn facility
 - a new signalised intersection at Solander Drive with a new western stub for access and a U-turn facility
 - a new signalised intersection at Luddenham Road with new turning lanes
 - an upgrade to the existing signalised intersection at Erskine Park Road with new turning lanes
 - modified intersection arrangements (left in, left out only) at McIntyre Avenue and Mandalong Close, St Clair
- a new shared path along the eastern side of Mamre Road, with provision for a future shared path on the western side
- reinstatement of bus stops near Banks Drive with provision for additional bus infrastructure in the future
- changes to property access at Mamre House, Erskine Park Rural Fire Service and other private properties
- drainage and flooding infrastructure upgrades
- new traffic signals and relocation of existing electronic signage
- new roadside furniture and street lighting
- noise walls along the eastern side of Mamre Road, St Clair

Features of the Mamre Road upgrade between Erskine Park Road, Erskine Park and Kerrs Road, Kemps Creek:

- three new signalised intersections
- upgrade of the James Erskine Drive intersection
- road widening: four lanes (two in each direction)
- wide central median for potential future widening to six lanes (three in each direction)
- shared user path provision

Will there be shared pedestrian and cycle paths?

Under the proposed design a new shared path for cyclists and pedestrians will be constructed along the eastern side of Mamre Road. The proposed design includes pedestrian crossing points at intersections, paths between intersections and pram ramps.

When will construction start and for how long?

We expect that construction of the upgrade between M4 Motorway, St Clair and Erskine Park Road, Erskine Park would start in 2024 and be completed in mid-2027, approvals, funding and weather permitting.

What plans are there for further upgrades of Mamre Road?

Future upgrades to Mamre Road would be delivered subject to funding.

Transport for NSW is currently carrying out investigation work between Erskine Park Road, Erskine Park and Kerrs Road, Kemps Creek to collect data to inform further planning and design of the upgrade. This work includes detailed land surveys, subsurface utility location and investigating ground conditions.
