More Trains, More Services

Mortdale Maintenance Centre is being upgraded to enable the entire Tangara fleet to be serviced from this location as part of the More Trains, More Services program.

Behind the walls of the maintenance centre, we have been constructing new maintenance sheds and upgrading facilities to introduce a new bogie exchange system. This system involves the construction of underground structures which will facilitate the transfer of bogies (the framework that carries the wheelset attached to the train) between the maintenance areas within the building.

What's been happening?

At Mortdale, we have:

- completed construction of the underground chambers that will host the bogie exchange equipment
- completed all concrete structures for new maintenance buildings
- installed the structural steel for the new buildings
- completed further electrical upgrade works inside the maintenance building.

What's next at Mortdale?

The progress achieved over the last few months will allow the project to start new activities. Between April and June, our construction at Mortdale will primarily involve the fit out of new buildings including the installation of mechanical equipment for the bogie exchange systems. We will also be working on completing the new car park at the substation, continuing to construct the new access road off Hurstville Road, and track work involving the installation of overhead wiring.
