### More Trains, More Services

Mortdale Maintenance Centre is being upgraded to enable the entire Tangara fleet to be serviced from this location as part of the More Trains, More Services program.

### What's been happening?

We have been working between 7am and 6pm daily inside the Mortdale Maintenance Centre on:

- construction of a new bogie exchange system which will enable train wheels to be automatically removed from carriages and transported for maintenance
- extending the driveway entrance from Hurstville Road to incorporate an exit road for improved safety during centre deliveries
- upgrading the electrical substation to support an increased electrical capacity.

### What's next?

As we enter the final quarter of 2021, construction will continue on the bogie exchange tunnels and upgrade of the electrical substation.

Over the next three months, work will continue on the new bogie exchange system, upgrading the electrical substation, extending the access from Hurstville Road and construction a new maintenance shed.

### Construction hours

The NSW Government has introduced new rules to support industry and continue the delivery of critical infrastructure during COVID-19. In accordance with the *Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID-19 Development – Infrastructure Construction Work Days No.2) Order 2020*, standard construction hours are **7am to 6pm Monday to Sunday, including public holidays.**

## New site access of Hurstville Road

Last month we established an exclusion zone on the verge beside the centre boundary fence from Hurstville Road, as indicated in the image below.

This exclusion zone has been implemented to safely enable the extension of the centre driveway and will be in place until January 2022.

A small amount of vegetation removal will be required to facilitate this work and an Ecological Assessment has confirmed no threatened species have been identified for removal. Traffic controllers will provide alternate access arrangements for pedestrians to bypass these activities.

## Construction during COVID

To ensure that we are able to keep the community and staff safe, we have implemented strict COVID-safe plans and practices on the construction site.

All work will be carried out in line with current NSW Government Public Health Orders and Restrictions, which are subject to change.
