

Start of work – safety improvements on the New England Highway, south of Uralla from Wednesday 1 February

The NSW Government is investing \$8.6 million through the Saving Lives on Country Roads Program to provide a safer journey for motorists.

Transport for NSW is carrying out safety improvements along a 4.5km section of the highway, about 18km south of Uralla. Work involves installing wider shoulders and a wider centreline, extending and upgrading drainage as required, road rehabilitation and surface improvements. We have included a map to show the area of work.

In preparation for this work to start, preliminary work on the project was completed in late 2022 and included vegetation removal, drainage and shoulder repairs.

We will be working between **6am** and **6pm weekdays** and **Saturdays**. We expect to complete the work in **late July 2023**, weather permitting. We will let you know in advance if we need to do any work outside these times.

How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which generates some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise by turning off machinery and vehicles when not in use.

Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe.

Traffic control, single lane closures with alternating flow and a reduced speed limit of 40km/h will be in place during work hours, which may affect travel times.

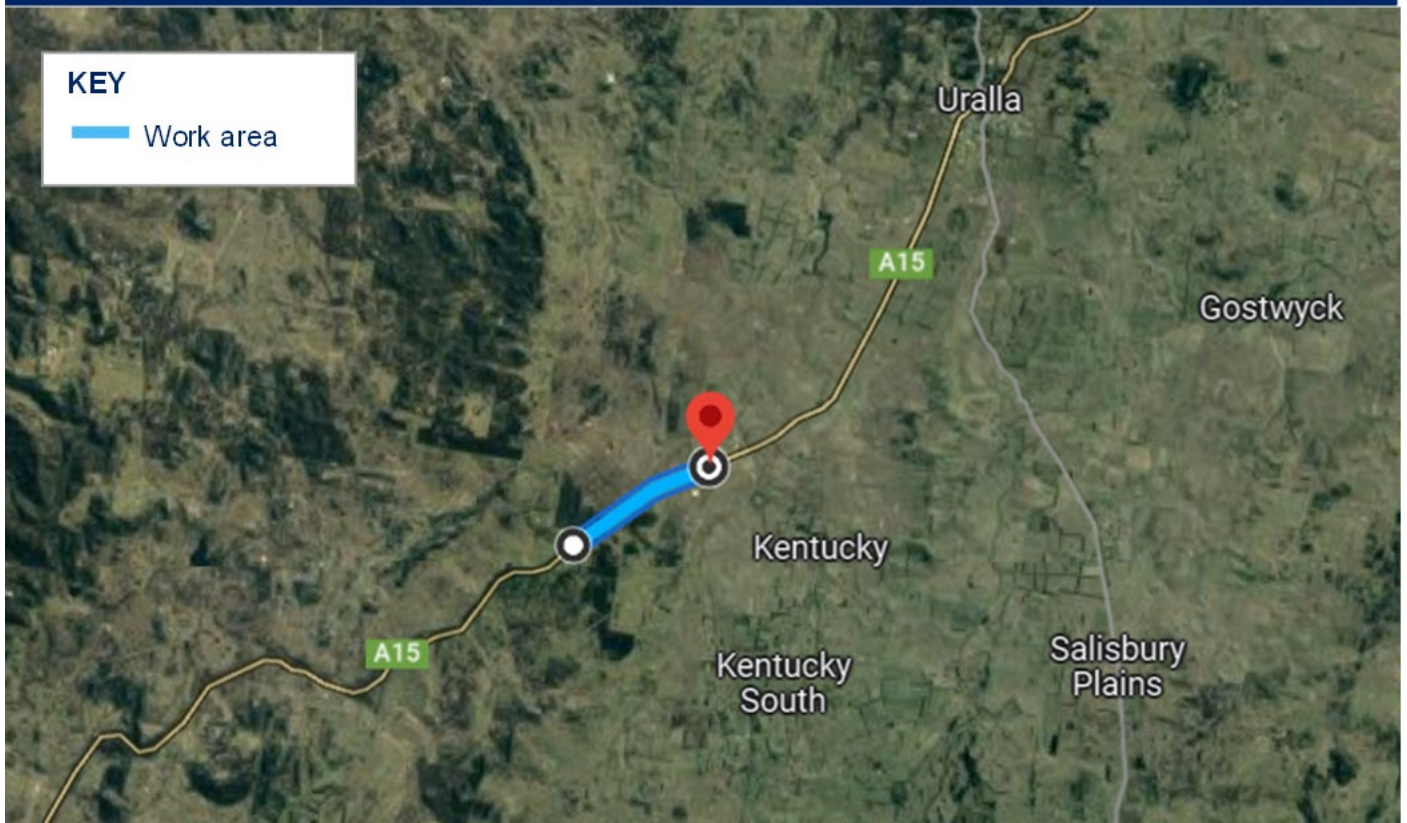
