

Night works on the Great Western Highway between Walang and Yetholme from 5 March

Essential maintenance work is taking place at Walang and Yetholme.

The work includes asphaltting to provide an improved road surface at multiple locations on the Great Western Highway between Walang and Yetholme. We have included a map to show the location of the work.

We will be working at night to minimise disruptions to traffic. Work will take place between **7pm** and **6am** from **Sunday 5 March** and expect to complete the work in **six days**, weather permitting. We will let you know in advance if we need to do any work outside these times.

Work will take place at the following locations:

- Intersection of Walang Drive and Great Western Highway – **5 to 6 March**
- Intersection of Timber Ridge Drive and Great Western Highway – **7 March**
- Intersection of Molybdonite Road and Great Western Highway – **8 to 10 March**

How will the work affect you?

The work will involve the use of machinery which generates some noise. We will make every effort to minimise noise by turning off machinery and vehicles when not in use.

Traffic changes

There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe.

Lane closures and a 40km/h speed limit will be in place during work hours and may affect travel times. Motorists should allow up to five minutes extra travel time during this work. Outside of work hours reduced speed limits of 60km/h and 80km/h will be in place.

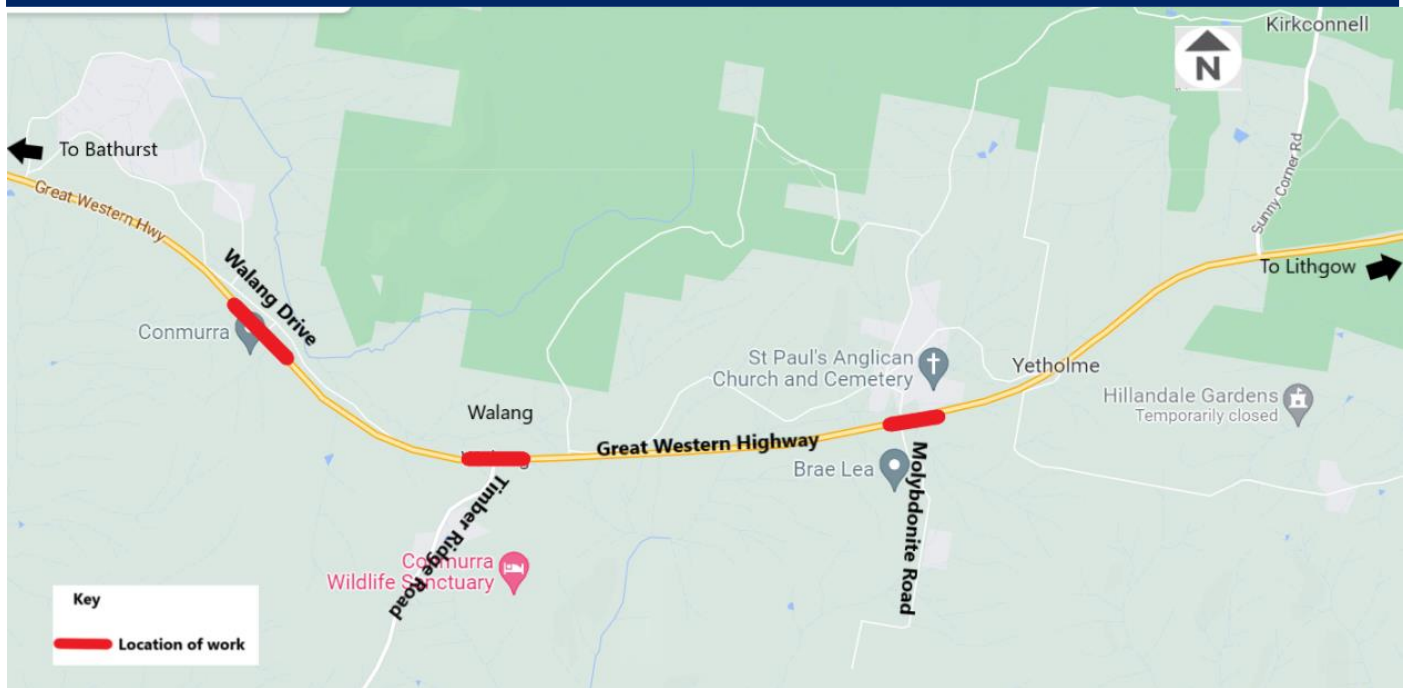
