


Closure on Station Street from 20 September for utility work

Medlow Bath Upgrade

September 2023







Transport for NSW pays respect to the Darug and Gundungurra people as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respects to Elders past and present.

Transport for NSW is continuing work to prepare for the upgrade of the Great Western Highway at Medlow Bath, between Railway Parade and south of Bellevue Crescent.

What work are we doing?

Works will be continuing in Station Street over the next four months including:

- Installing a sewer main, drainage and water main
- Carrying out piling work for the new pedestrian bridge
- Relocating Jemena gas pipes
- Temporarily removing the Telstra payphone and carrying out Telstra utility work
- Operating a vacuum truck
- Saw cutting, excavating and restoring the pavement.

Where and when we'll be working

Work in this area will start on **Wednesday 20 September**, weather permitting.

Daytime work hours will be **7am to 5pm, Monday to Friday** and **Saturdays** from **8am to 1pm.** There will be no work on Sundays or public holidays.

We may work at night for up to three nights per week, to reduce traffic impacts and ensure the safety of workers. Night work hours will be between **6pm and 7am**.

We will liaise directly with affected residents ahead of nightwork activities to discuss impacts and address any concerns.

We expect to finish this work in January 2024.

What will this mean for you?

To install the sewer main in a section of Station Street, we need to close the west-bound Station Street slip lane from the Great Western Highway and detour vehicles accessing Station Street to the signalised intersection. The slip-lane closure will start on Wednesday 20 September.

We expect the detour to be in place for up to four months. Please refer to the map over the page for more detail.

You may also notice:

- Traffic control, lighting and signage in place
- Noise from machinery and equipment
- Closure of one driveway at Blue Mountains Mazda, with one remaining open at all times
- Temporary removal of the payphone, which will be reinstalled when work is complete.

Managing our impacts

We manage our work to minimise impacts to the community and the environment. This includes:

- Working during the day where possible
- Maintaining pedestrian and property access
- Turning off machinery when not in use
- Installing noise mats around our work
- Staging work and grouping utility installation to reduce repeating work in the area at night.

Traffic Impacts

The slip lane off the highway onto Station Street will be closed and a detour via the traffic lights will be in place. A reduced speed limit of 40 km/hr and traffic controllers will be in place as needed.

All road users are advised to follow the directions of signs and traffic control and slow down on approach.
