


Construction update

Spring Farm Parkway Stage 1

July - September 2023





Transport for NSW acknowledges the Dharawal people as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pay respects to Elders past and present.

Spring Farm Parkway is a key eastwest link that will support the Greater Macarthur Growth region, meeting the needs of a growing population by connecting communities.

Work is continuing to advance on Spring Farm Parkway Stage 1. Since our last update, we have completed the main drainage works on Menangle Road. We are halfway through the installation of the box culverts within the project boundary.

Construction of the new central bridge columns on the Hume Motorway median are continuing and the retaining wall panels for the bridge are being prepared.

What work are we doing?

From July to September, several key activities will take place.

Work includes:

- continuing general earthworks
- utility installations and cutovers on Menangle Road

- installing and placing bridge girders on the new bridge over the Hume Motorway
- installing and backfilling of retaining walls
- continuing pavement widening in the Hume Motorway median
- continuing pavement widening and roadwork on Menangle Road
- laying new asphalt on the Hume Motorway
- installing new roadside drainage, kerbing, guardrail along the Hume Motorway and Menangle Road
- temporary concrete barrier relocation on the **Hume Motorway**

From September 2023, traffic travelling on Menangle Road will be moved onto an alternate section of the road. These important alignment changes will allow for further construction activities on Menangle Road. A map of the location and traffic movements is included on page 3.

Work to prepare for the traffic switch will involve resurfacing, line marking and installing temporary traffic barriers.



We will be working at night to minimise traffic impacts. We will notify you in advance if we need to do any work outside these times.

Our work schedule

Our standard work hours are **7am to 6pm**, **Monday to Friday and 8am to 1pm**, **Saturdays**, excluding public holidays, weather permitting.

From Sunday 2 July to Friday 29 September 2023, nightwork will be required in addition to work during standard construction hours to enable work on the Hume Motorway and Menangle Road to reduce impact on the travelling public.

During nightwork, construction hours are from **6pm to 5am, Sunday to Thursday** with no more than five consecutive nights of work at one time.

Traffic changes

From **July 2023**, there will be traffic changes on the Hume Motorway between Menangle Bridge and Mark Evans Bridge. A section of the northbound shoulder will be closed to enable construction of a work zone merge lane into the Hume Motorway.

To minimise traffic disruptions and reduce safety risks to workers and road users, reduced speed limits have been implemented around our construction areas. These include:

- 60km/h speed limit through the Menangle Road construction zone and outside of school zone hours
- 40km/h speed limit through the Menangle Road construction zone while work is being carried out near live traffic and/or night work.
- 80km/h speed limit through the Hume Motorway construction zone
- 40km/h on the Hume Motorway during night work

Electronic signage will advise road users of these changes. Please keep to speed limits and follow signs and traffic controllers' directions.

What will this mean for you?

During night work we may use noisy machinery and equipment such as large trucks, cranes, elevated work platforms, light vehicles, lighting towers, rollers, line markers, excavators, profilers and asphalt paving machines.

You may notice:

- workers and vehicles
- traffic controllers and signage
- road/lane closures, detours and reduced speed limits
- lighting
- noise from machinery and equipment

Managing our impacts

We aim to manage our work to minimise the impacts to the community and the environment. This work may be noisy at times, and we apologise for any inconvenience this may cause.

Where possible we minimise noise by:

- · turning off machinery when not in use
- positioning equipment such as generators away from properties
- undertaking noise monitoring
- communicating over radio and hand signals
- using non-intrusive reversing alarms on all machinery
- targeted lighting to minimise light spill
- completing high noise activities prior to midnight


Access will be maintained to local residents, businesses and Broughton Anglican College. Should we need to limit access at any time, we will contact you.
