Taree Station Upgrade

April and May 2023





Transport for NSW acknowledges the acknowledges the Biripi people as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pay respects to Elders past and present.

Transport for NSW is upgrading Taree Station as part of the Transport Access Program. The upgrade will provide a station that is accessible to those with a disability or limited mobility, parents/carers with prams and customers with luggage.

What work are we doing?

Over the next month the following works are also scheduled to occur:

- Completion of concrete works in the car park and bus stop
- Completion of all asphalt works in the car park
- Commencement of soft and hard landscaping, including installation of pavers to the station precinct area
- Finishing works such as installation of handrails, balustrade and tactile indicators
- Commencement of fit out works such as installation of plumbing, electrical, mechanical and security fixtures

When and where we'll be working

Standard construction hours are from 7am to 6pm Monday to Friday and 8am to 1pm Saturdays, excluding public holidays. We will continue to notify nearby residents and businesses in advance if we need to work outside these times.

Completed works

To date the following has been achieved:

- New stormwater drainage
- Changing the slope of the platform at the coach ramp and breezeway entry points to the station
- Upgrading the electrical distribution board
- Completed all demolition works
- Completed tiling works to the bathrooms and ticket office

What will this mean for you?


- Changes to traffic conditions: Asphalt works will occur over two shifts - traffic control will be on site to manage traffic and pedestrians.
- Temporary parking restrictions: Ten temporary parking spaces have been setup along Olympia Street. The permanent spaces will re-open in stages as work is completed.
- Temporary relocation of station facilities: the ticket office has been temporarily relocated to the western building, with temporary amenities available at the western side of the station building.
- Increase in construction traffic: vehicles will be accessing the construction area via the construction gate at the eastern end.
- Temporary change to platform access: access will be available from the Sydney end of the platform or the car park near Marathon Street.



equipment used will include generators, trucks, gurneys, circular saws, jack hammers, a crane or cranes, compactors, excavators, and various hand and power tools. Measures to reduce noise will be implemented including turning equipment off when not in use, positioning equipment as far away from properties as possible, using non-tonal reversing beepers, and stopping work for respite periods.

Project Completion

The project is scheduled to be completed midyear, weather permitting.
