



# Community Notification

## Taree Station Upgrade

June 2023



Transport for NSW acknowledges the acknowledges the Biripi people as the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pay respects to Elders past and present.

Transport for NSW is upgrading Taree Station as part of the Transport Access Program. The upgrade will provide a station that is accessible to those with a disability or limited mobility, parents/carers with prams and customers with luggage.

### What work are we doing?

Over the next month the following works are scheduled to occur:

- Completion of handrails, balustrade and tactile indicators
- Completion of fit out for the ticket office, waiting rooms and bathroom including electrical work, security and painting
- Adjustment to existing ticket counter
- Rectification of defects
- Installation of wayfinding signage and line marking
- Final clean and commencement of handover to NSWTrainlink

### When and where we'll be working

Standard construction hours are from 7am to 6pm Monday to Friday and 8am to 1pm Saturdays, excluding public holidays. We will continue to notify nearby residents and businesses in advance if we need to work outside these times.

### Completed works

To date the following has been achieved:

- All civil and concrete works, including asphaltting
- Landscaping
- All hydraulic and mechanical works inside the station building
- Wall and floor tiling for the toilets and waiting room

### What will this mean for you?

- **Temporary parking restrictions:** ten temporary parking spaces have been setup along Olympia Street. The permanent spaces will re-open in stages as work is completed.
- **Temporary relocation of station facilities:** the ticket office has been temporarily relocated to the western building, with temporary amenities available at the western side of the station building.
- **Temporary change to platform access:** access will be available from the Wingham end of the platform or the car park near Marathon Street.
- **Intermittent periods of high noise:** equipment used will include generators, trucks, gurney, circular saw, jack hammers, crane, compactor, excavators, and various hand and power tools. Measures to reduce noise will be implemented including turning equipment off when not in use, positioning equipment as far away from properties as possible, using non-tonal reversing beepers, and stopping work for respite periods.



## Project Completion

The project is scheduled to be completed late-June, weather permitting.
