Waterfall Stabling Yard and Platform Extension Project

More Trains, More Services

As part of the More Trains, More Services program, we are upgrading Waterfall Station, the stabling yard and associated rail corridor infrastructure to accommodate the Maryung fleet.

Upcoming night and traffic impacts

To minimise disruptions to motorists and improve the safety of the community and staff, we will be completing construction activity on the Princes Highway at night, when traffic flow is drastically reduced. This work is scheduled to take place between **6pm Monday 19 September until 7am Tuesday 20 September 2022**.

We will be working to replace the security fencing between the rail corridor and the Princes Highway, requiring the temporary closure of one southbound lane and the adjacent shoulder. The speed limit will be temporarily reduced to 40 kilometres an hour and traffic control and signage will be in place to assist motorists with these changes.

To safely complete this activity, we will be required to replace sections of the fencing in approximately 120-metre sections. This means we will need to complete this activity across multiple nights between September and December 2022. Concrete barriers will be positioned temporarily for short periods of time in between the removal of old fencing and installation of new fencing, and one southbound lane will always remain open to minimise impacts to traffic flow.

We will continue to keep you informed through the distribution of monthly notifications to residents and emails to our distribution list. If noise is anticipated to be intrusive at your address, we will contact you directly to discuss additional mitigation measures.

New Mariyung Fleet

The introduction of a new 55-train fleet with 554 new carriages will provide improved customer safety, accessibility, and comfort. This fleet has been called 'Mariyung', the Durug word for Emu, in acknowledgement of the local Aboriginal culture.
